

Although the meet did produce some records it offered few surprises. The powerful Terps, who have won the ACC outdoor event in all but one year of its 13 year existence, piled up 103 points. Second place South Carolina was far back with 54 points, just about where the experts had figured the second place team would be.

The 103 points scored by Maryland represented the second highest total ever scored in the annual meet. The Terps of 1959 scored 106½.

Following the two pace setters were North Carolina with 23 points, Duke with 19, North Carolina State with 17, Clemson with 15, Wake Forest with 14 and Virginia with 10.
