

CHAPEL HILL N. C. (AP) — Six records fell Saturday as Maryland's Terps swept to their seventh straight championship in winning the ninth annual Atlantic Coast Conference indoor games.

Coach Jim Kehoe's Terps piled up 61 points to 44 2-5 for second place North Carolina. Other scores: Clemson 28½, Duke 22 1-5, South Carolina 17 1-5, Virginia 13½, N.C. State 4, and Wake Forest 3 1-5.

Furman retained its title in the non-conference division by amassing 53 points. Florida was next with 27. VMI followed with 18½. The Citadel with 12, William and Mary 11½, Virginia Tech 8, Richmond 4, and Davidson 0.

Maryland also retained its title in the freshman division by finishing with 61 points. Duke had 22, Clemson 18, South Carolina 12, N.C. State 9, Wake Forest 7, North Carolina 5 and Virginia 1.

In all, 11 records were broken, including four in the non-conference and one in the freshman division. One record was tied in the freshman group.

Maryland's John Belitza cleared the pole vault at 15 feet to break his old record of 14 feet, 6½ inches set last year.

Clemson's Wesley King ran the 70-yard low hurdles in the record time of seven and four-tenths seconds. The old record of 7 and six-tenths seconds was set in 1956 by Duke's Dave Sime.

North Carolina's Tommy Clark, a sophomore from Greensboro, cleared the high jump bar at 6 feet 7¾ inches to break the old record of 6 feet 5 inches set jointly in 1961 by Maryland's Dick Estes and Jim Bland.

Duke's Dick Gesswein won the shot put with a record toss of 54 feet 5¼ inches. The old record of 54 feet 2¾ inches was set in 1958 by Dave Coates of South Carolina.
