Sierra track team takes Bay Valley meet

Both came out on top of the Bay Valley Conference's track meet Saturday. For the men, it was the second consecutive championship while the women have won the BVC two of the last three years.

Leisha Markham led the Wolverine women with a first place in the long jump and the javelin. Markham's javelin throw was 118 feet and

her long jump was 16.6.

Sierra finished the day with 171 points and second place Contra Costa finished with 164.

Maury Roberts of Sierra won the 5,000 meters. The Wolverines also

won the 3,000.

Paul Albers led the Sierra men's team with a hammer throw of 175 feet. Sierra's Ryan McCann took first place with a distance of 148.8 in the discus and Richard Terwilliger captured first in the high hurdles with a time of 14.8 seconds.

Stephan Moore finished first with a time of 54.8 in the intermediate hurdles and Dennis Luchay's polve vault of 12.6 ft. gave him first

place.

The Wolverine men rolled up 160 points, 30 points more than second place Contra Costa which finished just one point ahead of third place Yuba College. Solano college came in fourth with 70 points. Sierra took first place in five different events.
