

SF Wins Big 8 Meet; Sprinter Runs 9.7, 20.8

MODESTO — West Contra Costa Junior College's Rudy Jackson turned in record breaking sprints, :09.7 in the 100 and :20.8 in the 220, but the Rams of San Francisco easily outscored the second place Sacramento Panthers for the Big Eight Conference track and field meet championship.

San Francisco, sparked by Wilfred Gasper, totaled 139 $\frac{2}{3}$ points. Sacramento, which also finished second to the Rams in the dual meet standings, had 81 $\frac{1}{2}$, Modesto 59 $\frac{1}{3}$, WCC 56, Oakland 44, Santa Rosa 26, San Mateo 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ and Stockton 5.

Norton Held Record

Jackson's dashes bettered the :09.9 and :21.5 Big Eight marks held by Ray Norton, who ran for Oakland JC before becoming one of the nation's outstanding sprinters at San Jose State.

Four other meet records were set, three of them by Modesto athletes. The Pirates had Dave Maggard putting the shot 51-6 $\frac{1}{2}$, Tom Brown running the 880 in 1:53.2 and Brian Matravers negotiating the two mile in 9:34.5. The latter clipped 10 seconds off the mark he set last year.

Oakland's Rene Rogers won the mile in a record breaking 4:22.9.

Ramos, Helms

Sacramento's firsts came with Don Ramos, :49.3 in the 440, and Tim Helms, who tied at 13-8 $\frac{1}{2}$ with Gasper in the pole vault.

Gasper was the meet's high scorer with 24 points as he also tied, with teammate Fred Costa, at 6-4 in the high jump and placed third in the broad jump, won by teammate Mac Burton at 23-0.

Sam Perry of Oakland was a double winner in the hurdles. He took the 120 highs in :15.2 and the 220 lows in :23.5.

Becomes Ill

San Francisco won the mile relay in 3:22.5 when Ramos, racing the anchor lap for Sacramento, ran out of gas. Ramos became ill after winning the 440 but came back to run the 220, where he finished fourth, and then the relay.

The discus throw was taken by San Francisco's Mike Lewis at 150-9 $\frac{1}{2}$.

The first four in each event qualified for the north state JC championships Saturday in Santa Rosa.
