## Missouri Tigers Capture Honors in Valley Meet at Des Moines.

## Kansas University Second and Nebraska Third In Record-Breaking Field Day, in Which Eight Marks for This Section Are Shattered.

DES MOINES, IA., May 27.-Missouri won the fourth annual Missouri Valley conference meet, the classic of the West-Central States, here to-day, with 40 points. Kansas was second with 31 and Nebraska third with 29. The other teams finished as follows: Coe, 10%; Washington, 5; Ames, 5; Drake, 5; Des Moines, 614; Morningside, 8, and Grinnell, 14. Eight records were bettered. New marks were established in the mile run, quarter mile low hurdles, 220-yard dash, pole vault, twomile run, mile relay and high jump. Wilson, the slender Coe College sprinter,

wilson, the slender Coe College sprinter, fulfilled expectations by capturing the century in even time. Steele of Missouri, doped to break the record in the mile, could not stand the heartbreaking pace. Anderson of Nebraska crept into the lead and established a new mark of 4:26, which is :08 2-5 faster than the former figure, made by Thompson of Drake; Johnson, finishing second for Missouri and Durey of Des Moines was third; Nicholson of Missouri jumped for the tape in the high hurdles to get first place.

Quarnstrum won Morningside's points by taking second, Walker of Ames nosed out third honors. Reed of Nebraska sprung a great surprise by taking the lead in the quarter and, without faltering, striding across the tape in :50 flat, a new Missouri Valley record. Bermond, the highly touted Missouri runner, made a spurt in the stretch, but finished 3 yards in the rear. Anderson of Nebraska raced into third place.

The third record was shattered in the low hurdles when Kirksey of Missouri cleared the sticks in :25 flat. In the discus Missouri annexed 5 more point when

Steele of Missouri, slated to win the event, led on the last three laps until eighty yards from the finish, when Durey flashed by him in a twinkling. Scott of Ames was third. third
