to shoot at, the Missouri university aggregation with 60½ points almost tripled the points made by their nearest competitor in the fifth annual track meet of the Missouri valley conference this afternoon on Drake stadium.

Nebraska pulled into second place with 21 1-3 points by winning the two relay events, the only firsts taken by the Cornhuskers during the meet. Kansas was unable to win a first but piled up 18 1-3 points with seconds and thirds, closely pushed by Ames with 17 2-3 points.

While the meet was the fastest ever staged, it was the most one sided. Missouri was never in danger. The high hurdles were turned for a record of 15 2-5, just a fifth of a second slower than the world's mark, by Nich-

high hurdles were turned for a record of 15 2-5, just a fifth of a second slower than the world's mark, by Nicholson of Missouri and Bermond, his team mate, stepped the half in 1:57 flat, two and one-fifth seconds slover than the world's intercollegiate mark.
