

# MISSOURI VICTOR AT CONFERENCE MEET

**Takes First Place on Ferris Field at  
St. Louis, with Forty-One and  
One-Half Points.**

**AMES IN SECOND PLACE**

**Next Closest Competitor for First,  
with Twenty-Five Score.**

**ONE WORLD'S RECORD BROKEN**

**Hundred and Twenty-Yard Hurdles  
in Fifteen and Half.**

**RUNNER COLLAPSES NEAR TAPE**

**School of Mines, as Result of Cow-  
man's Weakening, Does Not Make  
Any Showing—Heat is  
Extreme.**

ST. LOUIS, May 31.—The University of Missouri won the Missouri valley conference track meet at Ferris field, Washington university, this afternoon, scoring 41½. Ames, the nearest competitor, scored 25. A

Despite the extreme heat a large crowd witnessed the events which were marked by the equaling of one world's record. This was in the 120-yard high hurdles, which John P. Nicholson of Missouri university negotiated in 15½ seconds. Cowman, of the Missouri School of Mines, collapsed in the 440-yard dash when within a few yards of the tape. He had led the entire distance. As a result of his collapse the school of mines did not score a point in the meet. He was the only entrant from the Rolla school.

Purdue was handicapped by the absence of its team captain, John Saylor, who was called home by the death of his father.

220-yard hurdle: Kirksey, Missouri, first; Case, Illinois, second; Hazen, Kansas, third. Time, 0:25½.

Discus throw: Thatcher, Missouri, first; Myers, Nebraska, second; Johnson, Ames, third. Distance, 125 feet.

Pole vault: Reavis, Nebraska, first; Floyd, Missouri, and Ray, Northwestern, tied for second; Godwin, Washington, and Talbot, Missouri, tied for fourth. Height, 11 feet 8½ inches.

220-yard dash: Applegate, Purdue, first; Kaiser Ames, second; Hilton, Kansas, third. Time, 0:22½.

Shotput: Thatcher, Missouri, first; Crull, Drake, second; Ruffner, Purdue, third. Distance, 40 feet 6 inches.

One-half mile relay: Illinois, first; Nebraska, second; Ames, third. Time, 1:30½, breaking conference record by 1½ seconds.

Running broad jump: Nicholson, Missouri, won; Godwin, Washington, second; Warrick, Nebraska, third. Distance, 23 feet 10 inches.
