

MISSOURI VICTOR IN M. V. MEET BY ONE-SIDED SCORE

**Ames Finishes Second, Drake
Third, Kansas Aggies Fourth
and Kansas Fifth.**

SIMPSON BREAKS RECORD

**Tiger Star Equals One World's
Mark and Sets New Valley
Time in Hurdles.**

OUTSIDER WINS HUNDRED

**Fairmount College Sprinter
Takes First in Short Dash
in Slow Time.**

COLUMBIA, Mo., May 29.—Special: With a well balanced team that took six first places, netting enough points to win, and an individual star who won 15 points, Missouri easily captured the eighth annual Missouri Valley track meet here this afternoon. The Tigers finished with 52½ points. The fight for second place was between Ames, Drake, the Kansas Aggies, and Kansas university, the former winning with 26½ points. The Drake athletes obtained 24 points, Kansas university 23, Kansas Aggies 21, Nebraska 12 and Fairmount college of Wichita 5. Drury, Tarkio, Central, William Jewell and Maryville Normal failed to place.

Two valley records were shattered and one world's mark was tied, Robert Simpson, the Missouri star, being responsible for the new time. When he negotiated the high hurdles in :15 he not only set a new conference record, the old time for the event being :15 1-5 made by Nicholson of Missouri, but he equaled the world's best time made by F. C. Smithson, on American in 1908.

Niedorp Wins Easily.

When he negotiated the low hurdles in :25 4-5 he clipped one-fifth of a second from the old M. V. record of :25 flat, held by Kirksey of Missouri.

Niedorp, Missouri's quarter miler, was not offered much competition in this event by Mellor, the Ames runner, who had been touted to push the Missouri man. Shearer of Drake scored another victory over his rival, Dickinson, the Ames sprinter, when he beat him to the tape in the 220 yard dash. Davis, a lone entry from Fairmount college of Wichita, Kan., gained a first by defeating the three men who had been considered fastest in the 100 yard dash, Zumwinkle of Nebraska, Dickinson of Ames and Shearer of Drake.

Tigers and Cyclones Disqualified.

The mile relay, one of the prettiest events of the day, was marred by the disqualifying of Missouri and Ames, which finished first and second, respectively. Murphy of Missouri and Wilson of Ames, both captains of their teams, locked arms shortly after the start of the race. They interfered with none of the other runners, but the race was given to Kansas university, which finished third.

Reavis, the Nebraska pole vaulter, went 11 feet 10½ inches in his event. Floyd of Missouri and Wilkins of Ames tied for second place at 11 feet 6 inches.

The winner of today's meet is considered the real champion of the valley as for the first time no teams were allowed to enter from states outside of the conference area. The chilly weather caused the appearance of a few overcoats on the stands, but the track was in good condition.

Shot put—Reber (Kansas) first, Krull (Drake) second, Marble (Kansas Agricultural) third, Groves (Missouri) fourth. Distance, 40 feet 7¾ inches.

One mile run—Barker (Ames) first, Weaver (Kansas Aggies) second, Sproul (Kansas) third, Thomas (Drake) fourth. Time, 4:33 1-5.

220 yard hurdles—Simpson (Missouri) first, Daggy (Missouri) second, Packer (Ames) third, Noble (Ames) fourth. Time, :24 4-5, breaking the conference record by one-fifth of a second.

220 yard dash—Shearer (Drake) first, Dickinson (Ames) second, Scott (Nebraska) third, Hilton (Kansas) fourth. Time, :22 4-5.

High jump—Frizell (Kansas Aggies) first, Johnson (Missouri) second, Burrus (Ames) and Packer (Ames) tied for third. Height, 5 feet 9 inches.

Mile relay—Kansas first, Kansas Aggies second, Drake third. Missouri and Ames disqualified for fouling. Time, 3:24 4-5.

Two mile run—Teeter (Kansas Aggies) first, Grady (Kansas) second, Kline (Missouri) third, B. Kline (Missouri) fourth. Time, 9:54 2-5.

Broad jump—Simpson (Missouri) first, Macher (Kansas) second, Williams (Missouri) third, Wilder (Kansas Aggies) fourth. Distance, 22 feet 9 inches.

Half mile relay—Missouri (Daggy, Eaton, Wyatt and Niedorp) first, Drake (Johnson, Lucy, Carson and Shearer) second, Nebraska third, Kansas fourth.

Final points—Missouri 52½, Ames 26½, Drake 24, Kansas Aggies 23, Kansas 21, Nebraska 12, Fairmount 5.
