

MISSOURI AN EASY WINNER

TAKES VALLEY TRACK MEET— KANSAS IS SECOND.

SIMPSON BREAKS A RECORD

Star Hurdler Takes the High Hurdles in 14 3-5 Seconds and Equals World's Record in the Lows— Drake Finishes in Third Position.

Columbia, Mo., May 27.—The University of Missouri today won the annual Missouri Valley conference track meet, scoring 49 points to 25 for Kansas, which won second place and 22½ for Iowa State, which won third.

Robert Simpson, the star hurdler of Missouri, made a new world's record in the 120-yard high hurdles, making the distance in 14 3-5 seconds. This is one-fifth of a second under his previous world record. Simpson also tied the world's record in the 220-yard low hurdles, making the distance in 23 3-5 seconds.

Besides the first three point winners, other colleges scored as follows: Drake, 16; Nebraska, 16; Grinnell, 10; Kansas Agricultural, 7; Simpson, 5; Fairmont, 4½; Washington, 0.

A heavy rain fell before the meet and as a result the track was heavy. In the mile relay, the only three entrants were disqualified for fouling. The cup was given to Missouri, however, for first place. Summary:

100-yard dash—Hoyt, Grinnell, won; Scott, Nebraska, second; Irwin, Nebraska, third. Time, :10 1-5.

220-yard low hurdles—Simpson, Missouri, won; Packard, Iowa State, second; Rennick, Missouri, third. Time, 23 3-5 seconds, equaling world's record.

220-yard dash—Hoyt, Grinnell, won; Davis, Fairmont, second; Scott, Nebraska, third. Time, 22 1-5 seconds.

Discus throw—Warren, Missouri, won; Reber, Kansas, second; Warnock, Drake, third. Distance, 124 feet 3 inches.

880-yard run—Keys, Kansas, won; Rider, Missouri, second; Merriam, Iowa State, third. Time, 2:01 3-5.

120-yard high hurdles—Simpson, Missouri, won; Packer, Iowa State, second; Noble, Iowa State, third. Time, 14 3-5 seconds, breaking world's record.

440-yard run—Wyatt, Missouri, won; Daggy, Missouri, second; Mellor, Iowa State, third. Time, :50 3-5.

Pole vault—Howell, Missouri, and Patterson, Kansas, tied for first; Irwin, Nebraska, third. Height, 11 feet 9 inches.

One-mile run—Hawthorne, Iowa State won; Sprowl, Kansas, second; Gableman, Missouri, third. Time, 4:29 3-5.
