

# TITLE TO IOWANS

The Cyclones Win Big Six Track and Field Championship With 67 Points.

## KANSAS U. IS SECOND

Seven First Places Taken by the Jayhawkers — No Records Are Broken.

Lincoln, Neb., May 20. (AP) —Iowa State's team strength today overcame the individual brilliance of Kansas university performers and the Cyclones took their first Big Six track and field outdoor championship with 67 points to 56½ for the second place Kansans.

The triumph gave Iowa State a "double" for the year, the Cyclones having taken the indoor meet at Kansas City.

Oklahoma, paced by Clarence Vicklund, whose victories in the mile and 2-mile gave the sparse crowd that gathered under unfavorable dripping skies two of its greatest thrills, finished in third place with 34½ points, Missouri took fourth with 32½, Nebraska fifth with 24½ and Kansas State sixth with nine.

### An Early Iowa Lead.

The 5-4-3-2-1 scoring system gave Iowa State the edge it needed to overcome the seven first places taken by Kansas through the work of Walt Isaacson, who won both dashes; Tom Scofield, broad and high jump winner; Frank Stannard, winner of both hurdles and LeRoy Robinson, javelin winner.

On the other hand, Iowa State won but two firsts—Harold Matejka taking the 880 and then pacing the Cyclone mile relay team to a last step victory over Oklahoma. But the Cyclones always seemed to be staging a procession of point winners and after they took a 7 to 6 point lead through a second a third in the mile run, opening event, never were headed.

No records were broken, but times of the running events were good considering the rainy morning and cloudy and partly rainy afternoon.

### A Husker Wins Quarter.

Top races of the day included the 440 in which Dean Kratz, Nebraska, nipped Bob Bradt of Iowa State, in the mile run, opening event, never which ten yards from the finish the entire field seemed to be running a dead heat. Isaacson took that race.

However, the real favorite of the crowd was Oklahoma's Vicklund, who came roaring up from second place to take the mile in a great finish, and repeated in the last 100 yards of the 2-mile to win going away. Matejka also got a great hand when he nipped Dave Day of Oklahoma in the last two yards of the mile relay that finished the meet.
