

Kansas won the team championship with a smashing total of 138 7-20 points. Oklahoma, which produced three individual winners and two record-breakers, was second with 83½ points. Following those two in the team tabulations were: Nebraska 68 7-20, Iowa State 55 3-5, Kansas State 49, Missouri 44 3-5 and Colorado 25 3-5.
