

# KANSAS CAPTURES 3D STRAIGHT TITLE; OKLAHOMA SECOND

BOULDER, Colo., May 22 (AP) — Records in the pole vault and 440-yard dash were smashed Saturday as Kansas rolled to its third straight Big Seven track and field championship before 8,500 fans at a mile high Folsom field.

A third record in the broad jump was set in Friday's preliminaries by Neville Price of Oklahoma.

Kansas' Wes Santee, fastest miler in the United States, ran the mile in 4 minutes 13 seconds, a new record for Folsom field, but far below his American record of 4:02.4. It was his only race Saturday.

Kansas amassed 134 points with Oklahoma second at 97. Other team scores were: Missouri 83, Colorado 46, Kansas State 36, Iowa State 34½, Nebraska 34.

Frank Dickey of Missouri pole vaulted 14 feet, 1¾ inches to erase the 14-1 mark by Bill Carroll of Oklahoma in 1949.

## 3d in Row

Oklahoma's Price carried away the broad jump championship for the third straight year with a conference record breaking leap of 25 feet ¾ inch. It broke his 24 feet, 11¼ inch mark of last year.

Frank Cindrich of Kansas clipped one-tenth of a second off the conference record by running the 440-yard dash in 47.9 seconds. The old mark was set in 1942 by Bill Lyda of Oklahoma.

Santee withdrew from the half mile run Saturday to permit his teammate, Lloyd Koby, to win his first Big Seven conference championship. Koby, a senior, has been outdistanced by Santee in their last two Big Seven meets. Santee ran the half mile in 1:51.8 in Friday's preliminaries. Koby's winning time today was 1:53.8.

## Ties Record

Colorado's Pat Hindman equalled the conference record in winning the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.2 seconds. Bud Gartiser of Missouri set the same time in 1948.

Assured of the team title, Kansas did not compete in the mile relay, the final event. Coach Bill Easton said he didn't see any reason for requiring his team to run.
