

Watson Wins Schulte Trophy With 3 Firsts

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) — Anthony Watson paced the University of Oklahoma to the Big Eight Outdoor Track and Field Championship as he won three events and anchored a record-breaking relay team.

Oklahoma piled up 101 points for its second consecutive Big Eight outdoor track title, Nebraska was second with 85 and Colorado finished third with 77 1-12.

Wind Too High

Kansas, dethroned last year by Oklahoma after nine consecutive championships, came in fourth with 72 5-12. Oklahoma State had 57, Missouri 45 1-3, Kansas State 35 1-6 and Iowa State 22.

Watson won the 100 in :9.4, the 220 in :20.1 and the broad jump 25-8 $\frac{3}{4}$. All would have been records if the wind had not exceeded the maximum allowable 4.473 miles per hour.

Watson handled the final carry as Oklahoma won the 440 relay in Big Eight record time of :40.7. He was awarded the Henry S. Schulte Memorial Trophy as the meet's outstanding performer.

The only other meet record was by Ted Woods, Colorado, with a spectacular 46.1 quarter mile, the fastest 440 by a Big Eight runner.

Oklahoma's winning relay effort eclipsed the record set by Kansas in 1959 of 41.0 seconds.

Nebraska's second place finish was due in large measure to domination of the high hurdles. Ron Moore, Bill Fasano, and Fred Wilke gave the Cornhuskers a one-two-three finish and 24 points in this event. Moore's winning time was 14.2.

Sullivan Wins Lows

Mark Sullivan, of Oklahoma, broke Nebraska's grip on the hurdles with a victory in the 220-yard lows. Moore and Wilke of Nebraska finished second and third. Sullivan's time was 22.9.

A last-ditch effort in the shot-put carried Dick Inman of Oklahoma to a victory over Don Smith of Missouri. Until his final put, Inman trailed Smith by nearly three feet. Inman's winning toss was 58-10. Smith's effort was 58-0 $\frac{3}{4}$.

Mark Brady, Oklahoma, and Don Blakley, Oklahoma State, defending co-champions in the high jump could do no better than a tie for third. Larry Eilert, of Iowa State, was the winner at 6-7 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Walt Myers, Oklahoma, was the discus winner at 166-8 $\frac{1}{2}$.
