# Anderson Leads KSU Women To Big Eight Track Title

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Terri Anderson established two Ahearn Fieldhouse records and one Kansas State mark Saturday to lead the Wildkittens to the Big Eight Women's Indoor track and field championship.

Anderson, a senior from Leonardville, Kan., was voted the meet's most outstanding performer. She set a school record of 10:22.3 in the twomile run. That broke the record of 10:32.2 she set two weeks ago in New York at the AAU National Indoor.

K-State scored 931/2 points to edge Iowa State by three points. Anderson won the 880, mile and two-mile runs.
