

Anderson Leads KSU Women To Big Eight Track Title

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Terri Anderson established two Ahearn Fieldhouse records and one Kansas State mark Saturday to lead the Wildkittens to the Big Eight Women's Indoor track and field championship.

Anderson, a senior from Leonardville, Kan., was voted the meet's most outstanding performer. She set a school record of 10:22.3 in the two-mile run. That broke the record of 10:32.2 she set two weeks ago in New York at the AAU National Indoor.

K-State scored 93½ points to edge Iowa State by three points. Anderson won the 880, mile and two-mile runs.

Kansas City — Misfortune played almost as big a role as performance in determining the outcome of the 48th annual Big Eight Conference Indoor Track Championships which concluded here Saturday night.

Defending champion Kansas, a prohibitive odds-on favorite to repeat, suffered the misfortune. Kansas State and Oklahoma turned in the performances. As a result, Kansas came up short and the Wildcats of K-State took home the team title.

The very first event of the evening at Municipal Auditorium signaled what was in store for Kansas coach Bob Timmons and his crew.

KU's Dennis Brack was disqualified from the high hurdles for a false start.

Harder to believe was the case of the

Jayhawks' John Roscoe. He came into the meet as the league's leading two-miler, yet was sidelined from that 24-lap event for a false start!

One event later, KU's Waddell Smith, a sure point-getter in the 440, fell while rounding one of the steep banked curves on the wooden oval and failed to finish.

But the payoff was yet to come. The Jayhawks could still win their eighth championship in Timmons' 11 years at Lawrence with a win in the mile relay — and the pole vault in which KU's Tad Scales was leading at the time.

The Jayhawks streaked to the lead in the relay event with leadoff runner Kevin Newell. But when he handed the baton to Jay Wagner, they dropped it!

In the meet's gattiest performance, the Jayhawks picked up the baton and from dead last roared to a second-place finish.

But that's just where they finished in the team standings after Oklahoma pole vaulter Jim Johnson pushed Scales into se-

cond place in that event with a record-setting leap.

Johnson cleared 17-3/4, a new Big Eight record and the highest jump ever for the Auditorium.

The 6,230 fans were treated to the most exciting finish in conference history. The K-State team hosted coach DeLoss Dodds on their shoulders for a premature victory ride before the official team totals were announced. Soon after, word spread that the outcome was still in doubt.

Nebraska, paced by two freshmen and a trio of sophomores, scored 19 points to finish fifth.

It was a great improvement for coach Frank Sevigne's charges who totaled just three points in a dead-last performance last winter.

Sophomore triple jumper David Green became the first Cornhusker indoor champion since Roger Chadwick (600 and 800) and Bob Unger (two-mile) won here in 1974.

Freshman teammate Neville Murray — both came to Lincoln from the same high school in Jamaica — was third in the triple jump to total nine of Nebraska's 19 points.

Freshman half-miler Ron Raber led defending champion Bob Prince of K-State until the final lap and finished second for another top Nebraska performance.

Prince, who also won the 600-yard event and ran a leg on the Wildcats' decisive mile relay team (a third place finish helped K-State hang onto its lead for the team victory), was voted the meet's most outstanding performer.

Nebraska's other points came from fourth-place finishes by sophomores Dean Herzig in the high jump and Steve Millard in the shot put, plus a fourth-place effort by the Huskers' mile relay quartet.

It was a bad night for defending champions. Seven were on hand, yet just two were victorious.

In addition to Prince in the 800, only Oklahoma's Randy Wilson in the 1,000-yard

run were successful.

KU's Cliff Wiley was second in the 60 dash, as was K-State's Jeff Schimmel in the mile. Don Duvall of Colorado was the defending champ in the triple jump — won by Green — and settled for fourth. OU's David Hodgins didn't do that well. He won the shot put last year but could manage no better than sixth.

KU's Waddell Smith, who fell in the 440, was the 600-yard champ a year ago. Switching him to a different event will be just one of many questions coach Timmons will have to struggle with until next year.
