On the infield at Bronco Stadium. just a few yards from where North-ern Arizona's track team was embarking on a victory run, the mood was somber in the Boise State camp.

Head coach Ed Jacoby and assistant Randy Mayo stood alone at midfield and pondered another lost opportunity. A few Broncos sat in the end zone and stared blankly at the thunderheads building overhead. Still others paced the field, shaking their heads and grimacing.

BSU had entered the 24th annual Big Sky Conference Track and Field Championships with its best shot vet at giving Jacoby his first league title in 14 tries. But in the end Saturday afternoon, another team was giving another coach the obligatory victory

dunk in the steeplechase pit.

Again.

NAU won only three events, but the Lumberjacks used their remarkable balance and preyed on every tiny BSU stumble en route to becoming the second school to win three consecutive Big Sky crowns. To the winner goes other spoils: The Axers clinched the Big Sky's All-Sports Trophy and also became the first school to win the league's indoor track, outdoor track and cross country titles in the same school year.

NAU scored 126 points and BSU was second at 116. Idaho was third at 80, followed by Weber State (78). Idaho State (77), Nevada-Reno (64), Montana (55) and Montana State (24).

"The thing that's so special about this is that nobody had won outdoors, indoors and cross country," said NAU Coach Ron Mann, squeezing water from his clothes and loving every second of it. "That shows we've got good

kids across the boards "

Jacoby's Broncos have similar denth and quality. In fact, Mayo had calculated that the meet would be close enough to turn on one or two events. Mann had figured the Lumberiacks and Broncos would each score 137.

But both coaches began to see the writing on the scoreboard Friday, when BSU slipped in the decathlon and NAU scored unexpected points in the discus. The points were subtle - a few here a handful there - but as the shadows began to creen across the blue turf Saturday, the points had added up in NAII's favor

"Nickel and dime stuff." BSII hurdler Bill Brown grumbled to teammate Steve Muse

So on an afternoon when many Broncos did themselves and their coach proud, they were hardpressed to bask in their individual efforts

"Our good guys did what we figured they'd do - in fact, even better." Jacoby said. "In fact, really, with two exceptions, we did about what we could do. They (NAU) just do a good job "

Muse epitomized the feeling He was voted the meet's outstanding overall athlete easily winning the discus and shot put, but he wasn't pleased with his toss of 58 feet, 2 inches in the shot. and he was crushed by the Broncos' second straight runner-up fin-

"I'm highly disappointed," the affable junior said quietly. "We just didn't get any breaks. Seldom do we get any breaks in the Big Sky championships."

Forgotten, for the moment. were BSU's five individual titles, three with marks good enough to top NCAA qualifying standards. Muse, Troy Kemp and Wendell Lawrence all had qualifying marks in winning their events. This was hardly news: All three had already qualified

Muse won the discus Friday, then Kemp regained BSU's prestige in the high jump early Saturday, winning with a meet-record mark of 7-41/2. The Broncos had owned the event for four years with Jake Jacoby, then lost it in a surprise last year when Montana's Mike Ehlers edged Kemp.

This year, there would be no surprises. Kemp was more than four inches better than Ehlers

"This was my day," Kemp said.

"I was prepared. I should win it " Asked how important it was to have the high jump title back at BSU, Kemp said: "It was very important for me - and Coach

Jacoby." Lawrence gave Bronco fans some hope by winning the triple jump while the 5.000-meter race was taking place a few yards away. Lawrence's mark of 53-101/4 was two feet better than Idaho's George Ogbeide. And by then, with only one other event - the 1,600-meter relay — still to go, BSU had a 105-101 lead over an NAU team that Mann had said was every bit as good as his two previous conference champions

Still, the Broncos would need a shocker in the 5,000, where NAU had the top three times entering the event, and in the relay, where the Lumberiacks were favored to win. There were no shockers in either event, though NAU finished 2-4-6 in the 5,000 instead of 1-2-3. Danny Holmes, BSU's only real hone to score in the 5,000, pulled out of the race midway, and the Broncos finished sixth in the relay, two spots behind NAIJ

So the Lumberjacks had overcome losing six points in a controversial and questionable disqualification in the 400-meter relay. And the Broncos had paid for narrowly missing in a few events. most notably the 110-meter hurdles, where Brown, the defending champion, was shaded by Montana State's Kelly Davis.

"The other thing that hurt us was we expected help from other teams that we didn't get," Jacoby said, "But, that's track and field.

Jacoby and the Broncos could have used the 10 points scored by former Capital High standout Frank Horn in the 1,500-meter race, but Horn runs for Montana. His time was 3:48.58.

Idaho continued its domination of the sprints, finishing 1-2 in the 100, first in the 200 and first in the 400-meter relay. Sophomore Pat-Williams, who's on the threshold of becoming a worldclass sprinter, won both the 100 and the 200, and the 400-meter relay victory was the Vandals' fifth straight.
