

BSU women earn Sky track title

MISSOULA, Mont. — Boise State won the women's team title for the first time since 1988 at the Big Sky Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships on Saturday.

The Broncos finished first, taking four firsts in the process.

Boise State scored 119 points, followed by Weber State with 101 and Northern Arizona with 76.

The BSU men's team finished second with 106 points behind

defending Big Sky champion, Weber State, which scored 149 points to take the team title. The Boise State men also won four individual Big Sky firsts.

Joyce Rainwater of Eastern Washington was named female track athlete of the meet. She set a Big Sky Championships record in Friday's 100-meter trial and won that final on Saturday. She then broke the 200-meter mark with a time of 23.84 seconds. The old mark was 24.09 by Weber State's Elizabeth Kealamaki in 1992.

Three other women's meet re-

cords were broken Saturday for a total of six.

Anna Soderberg of Northern Arizona, voted field athlete of the meet by coaches, won the shot put on Friday and set a Big Sky Conference record in the discus on Saturday. Soderberg, from Sjugesta, Sweden, threw the discus 179 feet, 4 inches to smash the old meet mark of 177-11 by Lori Parker of Northern Arizona in 1989.

Other championship records Saturday were established by Boise State freshman Abigail

Ferguson, who jumped 40 feet, 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches to break the old triple jump mark of 40-8 $\frac{1}{2}$. Weber State's Shawna Cox ran the 800 meters in 2:07.61 to nip the old mark of 2:07.74.

Cox also won the 1,500 meters to join Rainwater, Soderberg, Cox and Montana's Shelley Smathers as double winners. Smathers captured the 3,000 and 5,000 on Saturday.

BSU's women won the 4X100 with a time of 45.68 with Ruth Brown leading off, followed by Andy Holmes, Jovita Davis and Mishalooney Looney.

"We didn't have a big roster," BSU coach Ed Jacoby said. "But the girls competed hard all season and continued to do so in this meet, so the victory is a tribute to their hard work."

Weber State distance runner Robby Duncan was named male athlete of the meet after the Wildcats won their second straight Big Sky title. Montana State finished third with 94 points.

BSU's Walter Reed edged previously undefeated teammate Kerry Lawyer to win the Big Sky title in the 100 meters by .02 of a second. Reed was clocked at 10:41 and Lawyer at 10:43.

Boise State won the 4x100 relay with a time of 40.83 with Rashid Gayle, Carlos Albury, Reed and Lawyer outclassing the field.

Duncan won the steeplechase and placed sixth in the 1,500.

Kristian Pettersson of Northern Arizona, ranked fifth in the NCAA in both shot put and discus, won his specialties and was named field athlete of the meet. There were no meet records on the men's side.
