UM men tied for lead after first day

POCATELLO, Idaho – A strong opening day on Friday has University of Montana men's and women's track teams poised for their best finishes in years at the Big Sky Conference indoor championships at Idaho State's Holt Arena.

The Grizzly men, whose best finishes indoors were third places in 1982 and 1993, are tied for the lead with defending champion Weber State with 44 points. Montana State is in third with 40.

The women, who tied for second in 1989 but haven't cracked the top three since '94, are in second with 34 points, one behind Weber State and one ahead of Northern Arizona. Defending champion Montana State holds a commanding lead with 61.

The bulk of the finals are set for Saturday, when action starts at 10:30 a.m.

"We had more points than we were expecting after the first day," UM coach Tom Raunig said of the men's team, which was paced by strong individual performances by sophomore Dan Casey and senior Bryan Anderson.

Casey, from Helena, and Anderson, from Whitefish shared first place in the high jump. Both cleared 6-feet, 101/2 inches.

"They did a good job of keeping each other fired up," said Raunig. "They did a good job of stepping up to the competition,"

Ted Cordeiro of Cascade, the Big Sky leader in the weight throw during the season, finished fifth. But teammate B.J. McKay of Polson placed fourth, so Montana netted nine points out of the event. Montana State throwers dominated, placing 1-2-3. Zach Jones won, Blake Jackson was second and Shaun Ross of Stevensville was third.

UM's Trevor Gunlock place fourth in long jump with a leap of 23-8½, and the distance medley relay team from Montana finished a surprise second behind Weber State.

Anderson tied for the second-fastest time in the men's 55 hurdles preliminaries. Aaron Buckendorf was third in the 400 preliminaries.

On the women's side, junior Renee Dunn placed second and freshman Shannon Selby was fifth in the long jump. Dunn, of La Center, Wash., leaped 18-10¾, a mark that led until Montana State's Lacy Hinzpeter closed out the event with a jump of 19-9¼.

"Renee probably had a bigger jump in her, but she couldn't get it on the board," Raunig said.
