



Miscellaneous

- Los Angeles Times Publisher 1960-80
- LA Times had been in the family since 1882 spanning three previous generations
- His father started Otis' newspaper career in the press room making \$48 per week. He literally worked in all facets of the business -- including production, reporting, mail room and management -- prior to becoming publisher
- Presented with Walter Cronkite Award for Excellence in Journalism in 1986
- LA Times won 9 Pulitzer Prizes during Chandler's tenure as publisher
- After his death his executive secretary from 1962 to 1988 Donna Swayze was quoted as saying "he used
 the same tone of voice with the President of the United States and the guy who came to change the
 lightbulbs in his office."
- "No publisher in America improved a paper so quickly on so grand a scale, took a paper that
 was marginal in qualities and brought it to excellence as Otis Chandler did," wrote David Halberstam in his
 book "The Powers That Be" about the news media.
- 1987 Founded Chandler Vintage Museum of Transportation and Wildlife in Oxnard, CA
- 1955 Southern California AAU heavyweight weightlifting champion
- Son Michael Chandler is a former race car driver that competed in Indianapolis 500 three times
