

Miscellaneous

- World recognized bridge designer
- Was the chief engineer on the Vincent Thomas Bridge in San Pedro, a 1,500-foot long suspension bridge crossing the Los Angeles Harbor and the first welded suspension bridge in United States. The only suspension bridge in the world supported entirely on piles.
- Jurkovich was instrumental in bringing pre-stress concrete bridge design to California
- Served in military in World War II and Korean War
- Joined California Division of Highways after college and worked for Caltrans for 47 years
- 1966 won world-wide bridge design competition sponsored by US Steel
