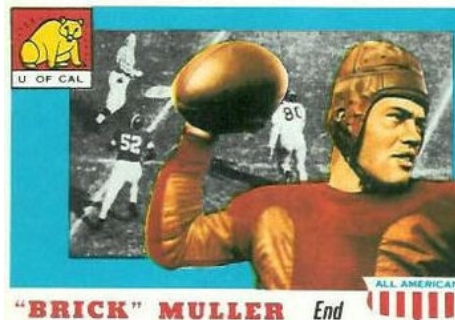


HAROLD "BRICK" MULLER

Died: May 17, 1962 Berkeley, CA (60-years old)

- 1916 finished third in state high jump
- 1918 state high jump champion
- 1918 CIF Southern Section high jump champion
- Football
 - 1916 All-Southern California 1st team
- Baseball
 - 1918 led team in batting (.518) as pitcher/outfielder
- San Diego Sports Association Breitbard Foundation Hall of Fame

Oakland Tech High School

- 1919 state high jump champion
- 1919 state long jump champion
- 1919 state 120 high hurdles 3rd place
- 1919 CIF North Coast high jump champion
- 1919 CIF North coast long jump champion

California

- 1920 Olympics high jump silver medalist
- 1920 Western Olympic trials champion
- 1921 IC4A high jump champion

- Cal won 1921, 1922 and 1923 IC4A championships
- Football
 - Member of College Football Hall of Fame inaugural class
 - Bay Area Sports Hall of Fame
 - University of California Hall of Fame
 - Rose Bowl Hall of Fame
 - 1921 Rose Bowl Most Valuable Player
 - First All-American from the West Coast

 - 1920, 1921, 1922 undefeated national champions (27-0-1)

Miscellaneous

- Father Edgar Muller was a principal in San Diego before moving to another principalship in Oakland. Eventually became Alameda County Superintendent of Schools
- Mother, the former Bernice Berwin, was a noted radio personality in Bay Area
- Got his nickname “Brick” from his red hair
- While worked on his degree in medical school, he served as Cal assistant football coach 1923-25
- In 1926 with the professional football Los Angeles Buccaneers as a player/coach.
- “Brick Muller Award” is presented annually to the top University of California lineman
- During World War II served as a major at Army Medical School
- Orthopedic surgeon and served as 1956 US Olympic team medical advisor
- California football team physician for 15 years
- Died of a heart attack while on a medical house call
