Colorado A&M Takes Lead With Hammer

University of Utah's stock in Saturday's Skyline Six track and field finale took a nose-dive in Friday's trials when the Utes batched up two places in the 440-yard trial heats, qualifying only one of three possible men in this event.

This unexpected reversal put the Utes out of the favored spot and gave the prediction nod to Denver University.

Utes Fumble Ball

The Utes' first setback came in the first heat of the quarter-mile, when Don Brown, trailing the fast Jack Christiansen of Colorado A. & M., and Lex Marcussen of Utah State tried to bug the No. 1 lane, make a pass on the inside and lost out to the Aggie runner.

The second bad break came in the next heat, when Don Perkins led all the way, but slowed up at the tape to have Homer of Brigham Young jump in front of him at the finish and put him out of the finals.

Both Perkins and Brown had defeated Homer and Marcussen in dual meets this year.

Vic Henriques was the only Ute to qualify, which meant that Henriques would likely be sent to Utah for the half-mile finals Saturday. Coach Pete Couch figured Friday night that these two breaks took about six or eight possible points from the Utes in the Saturday picture.

Denver meanwhile qualified 12 men in the 440-yard run, the dashes, broad jump and the hurdles. Utah and Utah State put seven each in these deals. Wyoming came up with nine placers, BYU three and Colorado A. & M. came in with two.

Rams Leading

The Rams took the early lead in the meet however when they garnered first, third and fourth places in the hammer finals Friday for 10 points. Utah State's Art Gottfredsen was second for four points and Utah trailed with Hal Hardcastle's singleton in fifth place.

The hammer winner was light-weight Frank Hemaley of the Rams who spun the -chained weight for a nifty 157.5 feet on a slippery field. His mate, Al Regel was third and Herb Ballou was fourth.
