NOTE:

In the early 1970s rules makers declared that "all measurements of height or distance shall be recorded to the lesser quarter-inch in measurements of less than 100 feet; and to the lesser inch in all measurements over 100 feet (hammer, javelin, discus). Examples: A reading of 6-7 3/8 should be recorded as 6-7 1/4 and a reading of 24-7 5/8 as 24-7 1/2, but 181-0 3/4 should be recorded as 181-0 and 227-7 7/8 as 227-7.

When I started my research I used this ruling for all marks even those before the 1970s.
