COMMENTS: It probably takes a knowledge of the hilly 4.0 mile Mt. SAC cross country course to appreciate what happened on it in the 1974 State Cross Country Championships.

With the meet coming back to its origin (on its tenth anniversary) it was fitting that the fastest time ever run in the State Meet was run on this particular course. The 19:19.6 clocking by the 18 year old Frosh from Glendale College (small college division) bettered Ollie Oleson's (Santa Monica) 1967 mark of 19:20.7 which, by the way, was run on the Fresno City College course (the same course as will be used for the 1975 State Championships). Bob Thomas' effort is even more remarkable when you consider he finished 58.2 seconds ahead of the second place runner, 17.2 seconds faster than John Olswang's winning effort in the large college division, and ran better than 25 seconds faster than the all-time course record at the start of this year. Individually, John Olswang of Orange Coast did himself justice with his 19:37.3 mark (the third fastest all-time runner on the MSAC course for the fourth fastest-ever time).

"Upsets" were in order, but that's not new to State Meet competition. These "upsets" only point out the competitiveness of the State Meet each year and the importance of keeping the State Meet a fair representation in numbers between the North and the South. To decrease representatives would do an injustice to our State Championships - as was proven again.

It was a very tight battle for honors after conceding the outstanding divisional championship teams (Grossmont and Glendale) the just honors. In the small college division 21 points only separated 2nd from 4th and 95 points between 5th place and 10th. In the large colleges it was even tighter. Second, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth places were only separated by 15 points, the entire field from 2nd to 10th by 94 points.

We mention the fact that the South has kept their team and individual winning record intact only because of the professional respect all the J.C. coaches of the state have for each other. The annual battle between the North and the South is in fun, and as we know, the South must blow its horn in cross country - especially after last year's State Track Meet.

It was asked by several that our written history be maintained and that our all time scoring table be used as a means of ongoing comparisons. We have adjusted it here to include the 1974 results. On the "single division structure" scale of 10-8-6-4-2, and on a scale of 5-4-3-2-1 after two divisions were established. The top ten rankings look like this - Mt. Sac (40), Grossmont (36), L.A. Valley (31), Pasadena (22), Fullerton (20), Bakersfield (19), Santa Ana (18), Pierce (14), American River (13), El Camino and Citrus (12).
