Defending champion Wheaton college won eight events and shared first in another for 88½ points and a walkaway victory in the College Conference of Illinois championship track meet today.

North Central was second with 30 points and Millikin garnered 27½ to take third.

The Little Nine conference track meet and golf and tennis tournaments will be staged in Decatur next spring, it was announced last night by Ralph Allan, J. M. U. athletic director.

4:32.8 to break the record of 4:33.1. Marvin Johnson of Carthage set a new mark of 163 feet 6½ inches in the javelin, and Jim Rust of Wheaton broke his own record of :50.6 when he turned the 440 in :49.9.

Other record breaking performances were fashioned by Hap Germann, Wheaton, who clipped two tenths of a second off his own mark in the century; Ed Schaefer of Millikin, 15.6 in the high hurdles; Dick Lush of Illinois Wesleyan, who lowered the 220 dash mark from 22.6 to 22; Byron Crozier of Wheaton and Bob Downing of Augustana tied at 6 feet 2 inches in the high jump to share a new record. Germann of Wheaton lowered another of his own marks when he stepped off the 220 lows in 23.7. Wheaton's mile relay team set a new record of 3:27.2.
