

Local School Makes a Fine Show in Third Place; Meet Is Won by Pasadena High

Packing up against just exactly 200 athletes of ambitious character and of muscular bodies, the San Bernardino high school track team yesterday afternoon ran, jumped and leaped itself into third place in the All-Southern California track meet, despite the fact that one Charlie "Speed" Paddock and a corps of assistants grabbed first place and the cohorts of Manual Arts school of Los Angeles barely missed out the Cardinals for second place, four points being the narrow margin between third and second honors.

Thirty schools were entered in the classic and the stopping place of the local school in the list of winners is understandable. For years the locals have been content, by force of habit, to be among the lowest in the list, but yesterday the Cardinal athletes tired of the lower altitude and sought a place in the hall of fame. From the very beginning in the morning's preliminary events, the announcer twisted his tongue saying "San Bernardino" many times.

When one wasn't forced to admire the specimens in which the young Mr. Paddock stepped about, the efforts of the local athletes attracted much attention. Paddock had his mind all set to win first place in his two sprint events and persuasion was useless. He broke his own record in the 100 yard dash and won the 220 yard dash, leading in the last 20 feet. Ten seconds flat is the new record for the country. Over and it is liable to stand for many years, as few such travelers as Tommy Eryx as Paddock exist in these parts.

Cook in Fast

Cook was second in the 100 yard dash, being trimmed by the Pasadena track team just three feet, standard measurement. He also grabbed third place in the 220 yard dash and ran a fast lap in the relay.

Just a few minutes after Starter Bob Weaver gave his opening lecture to the 15 half-mile runners who opened the afternoon's entertainment, records began to fall with resounding whacks. Paddock lowered the 100 yard dash mark, while Schiller of Poly clipped a second off the 440 mark and Johnny Boyle, who studied a little at the Los Angeles high school, neatly threw the discs away, setting a new mark of 115 feet 11 1-2 inches.

San Bernardino men failed to take a single first place, but were there mostly in getting second and third places. Draper was second in the 800 meters, Red Muller of San Diego in the high jump, and took third place in the high hurdles, while Harry McDonald, the distinctive runner, topped in second in the 440 yard dash and headed around the course for a third position in the low hurdles. McDonald and Draper shared the honors with Lloyd Cook for the Cardinals.

In the relay, the Johnson quartet again failed to take first place, but were awarded second. McDonald was beaten at the tape after Krohn of Manual Arts had stepped on McDonald's heels for 200 yards of the final lap.

A stray point was added to San Bernardino's numerals in the pole

vault, when Henry Alvarado, by iron jaw determination, leaped over the bar at 10 feet six inches, which was several inches higher than he had ever been off the earth before. His leap brought much applause from local roosters. Eleven feet won the vault.

Redlands, the school which won the Citrus Belt meet a few weeks ago, made a poor showing and was left six points much to the delight and jubilation of the local students, who have a grudge against their cross-rivalry neighbors.

The crowd was one of the largest that ever attended an athletic event of any description in the city. It was perfectly handled by the students who had the management of the affair.

Following the meet Coach Johnson was a happy man and could not see his way to the work of his profession. He will send the relay team, composed of Cook, McDonald, Coombs and Ingram and high jumper Draper to Sacramento to compete in the state meet. The appearance of San Bernardino high school men in a state meet will be the first since Howe and Campbell, both of yesterday, captured two places at Berkeley several years ago. The results:
