

NORMAN PAUL STARS AS SAINTS ANNEX HONORS

San Diego Takes Second Place as Sprinters Fail; Lyman Sets New Shot Put Record

After coming within an ace of winning the Southern California meet for the past several years, Coach Tex Oliver's Santa Ana Saints finally broke the jinx yesterday at Housh Field, L. A. High and for the first time in the history of the Saint school annexed the much-coveted Southland prep track-and-field championship.

Santa Ana took 17 points for first place, while last year's champions, San Diego, placed second with 15. Coach Dick Arnett's Inglewood Sentinels amassed 12 1-8 points to finish third, with Santa Monica and Poly tying for fourth with 10 5-8 points apiece.

Alvin Koenig, diminutive Huntington Beach sprinter, took both dashes to give the Spudgers 10 points and fifth-place honors.

The rest of the places were as follows: Manual Arts, 9; Long

The fair-haired boy for Santa Ana was Norman Paul, husky "iron man," who annexed the low hurdles by 10 yards from a fast field in 24 4-5s., besides taking first in the broad jump with a leap of 22ft. 8 1/2 in.

Paul also ran a speedy lap on the relay team, which placed third, and competed in the shot, failing to place in the iron-ball event.

22ft. 7in., hitting the take-off board with his right foot. During football season he injured his ankle, making it impossible for him to use his right foot on the take-off. This year, Oliver changed him over to a left-footed jumper and, although it wasn't natural for him, Paul responded nobly as the results of the meet show.

Paul doesn't like to run hurdles either, but Tex figured that he had possibilities and made him run them.

Alvin Reboin and Doyle Gilbert were the Saints' other entries in the meet. Reboin competed in three events also, taking second in the high hurdles, fifth in the low sticks and tied for fourth in the pole vault.

Gilbert placed fourth in the broad jump.

San Diego's hopes for retaining the title were more or less ruined last Saturday when rain postponed the meet. The squad spent too much time traveling back and forth between here and the border city for their own good.

The first event on yesterday's program, the 100-yard dash, saw Fernando Ortiz, San Diego's hopes for first, drop into second place behind Koenig of Huntington Beach. Koenig had been set back a yard and still had enough to win by a yard in 10s.

Ortiz and Jimmie Willson failed to place in the furlong, with Koenig again leading the way to the tape in 22 3-5s. Willson's bad leg hampered him considerably, while Ortiz seemed to be affected by the cold weather.

One new Southern California record was made, John Lyman of Santa Monica breaking Bud Houser's mark of 54ft. 3in. in the shot put. Lyman tossed the twelve-pound ball 54ft. 7in. All the rest of the men placing in the event were over 50ft.

The quarter-mile was the best race of the day with Clark Satterfield of Manual Arts, Jimmy LuValle of Poly and Irvine Warburton of San Diego all hitting the final stretch side by side. Satterfield had the most stuff and won by inches with LuValle taking second. The time of 50 1-5s. was very fast, considering the conditions.

Another tight race was the mile. Jimmie Lawrence of Manual Arts led all the way until the last ten yards, when Evans Dowers of San Diego sprinted past him. Lawrence came back and ran even with Dowers to the tape. Officials ruled Dowers won. The time was 4m. 32 3-5s.

CITRUS ANNEXES CLASS B TITLE

Lincoln and Santa Maria Tie in Class C Meet

Class B and Class C track champions of Southern California were crowned yesterday afternoon when the meet was finally completely run off at Housh Field at La Angeles High School. Citrus High, amassing a total of 14 points, was the winner in the Bee meet, with the L. A. High Romans a close second with 12½ digits. Lincoln and Santa Maria tied for first place in the Class C meet with 10 points apiece, Manual Arts coming in third position with 9½ points.

In the Class B 100-yard dash, Cooper of Polytechnic tied the record of 19.2s. set last year by Mansur of Hemet, and Moore of Jefferson traveled the 120-yard low hurdles in 13.8s. to break the mark of 13.8s. set last year by Garland, Roman hurdler. In the Class C 120-yard low barriers, Tatum of Compton finished first in the fast time of 14s. flat, supplanting the record of 14.1s. established by Ford of Pasadena four years ago.
