EIGHT MARKS GO

Lightweight tracksters broke eight records, five on the track and three on the field. Roy of Jefferson won the 400 in 1m. 28 1/2. Brown of Jacob Hill set a new mark in the 200 at 28.6. Hakey of Jordan won the high hurdles in 8.45. McNeill of Bell hung up a new mark by running the 1000 in 3m. 28.8, breaking the old mark by nearly 2 1/2 seconds. The Washington relay quartet was timed in 1m. 8.45 for another new mark.

Perhaps the outstanding record of the Bee meet was made in the pole vault by a chunky chap by the name of Monk, who hails from Washington. He cleared the dizzy height of 12ft. 3 1/4-in., a mark that was bettered by exactly one-quarter of an inch by the winning Class A vaulter. The first four place winners in the discs all beat the old record. Sharp of Glendale, the winner, hung up a new mark of 170ft. 17-in. Oswald Hira of Santa Maria, who last week jumped 20ft. 3 1/4-in., cleared best 119ft. 7 1/4-in. to win his favorite event yesterday. His mark, made in the preliminaries, will be accepted as a new mark, however. Hira was a Junior Olympic Games star last year.

Three records were broken in Class C ranks and one was tied. Trejo of San Luis Obispo set a new mark in the 400 at 1m. 28.8. Davis of Hoover ran the low hurdles in 23 1/2 for another record. Furman of Compton went over 11ft. 8 1/4-in. in the pole vault for the last record of the morning. University's relay team tied the Hermet record of 48.2s. in the 400-yard relay. The summaries:
