Living up to their name the Jack-rabbits of Long Beach Poly ran off with the Southern California C.I.F. track-and-field championship yesterday at Housh Field, L. A. High.

Coach Norman Barker's Hares amassed the amazing total of 25 1-3 points, more than 7 digits ahead of Vic Francy's Hoover High team, which was second with 17. Poly tallied 15 points for third, while San Diego, through the great work of Fred Montpellier, took 14 for fourth. Manual Arts was a bang-up fifth, while Montebello rang up 9 points for sixth.

Long Beach, favored to win, lived up to advance notices with eight of their nine-man team making points. Fred Rathbun started the parade with a second in the 880. The landslide became more apparent when the results of the discus showed Leonard Holland and Arlo Munch taking the first two places. Tom White had a great day, winning the broad jump at 22ft. 9in. and then getting

second place in the pole vault with a leap of 12ft. 9 3-4in.

COLLIER OFF FORM

After being disqualified in the high hurdles for knocking down three hurdles, Gordon Lewis grabbed off fourth in the low sticks. Walt Middleton took fifth in the broad jump, while Collier and Voorhies tied for fifth in the high jump. Collier was off form. He had previously done 6ft. 3in. and his leap of 5ft. 9½in. yesterday was the sole disappointment on the Jackrabbit team.

Three Class A meet records were shattered. The first to go was in the 880 when Ray Cartwright, Santa Ana flyer, broke loose from the pack and won in 1m. 56.6s., with Rathbun a good second. The old record was 1m. 58s., set in 1928 by Dave Foore of L.A. High.

Big Bill Sefton, Poly's giant pole vaulter, cleared 13ft. 3 5-8in. to wreck the old mark of 13ft. 2 5-8in. which was set in 1928 by Miller of San Diego.

Cornelius Johnson, L.A. High's consistent high jumper, did 6ft. 3 5-8in. to win the event and to wreck the old record of 6ft. 3 1-8in. set in 1928 by Bob Van Osdel of Compton.

HOOVER SURPRISE

Hoover was the surprise package of the meet. With an enthusiastic band of rooters on hand that let out wild yells every time Hoover's name was mentioned, it appeared that Francy's team couldn't go wrong. Dubby Holt won the 100 and then placed fourth in the broad
