

# Wilson Captures Prep Title With 27 1-2 Points

## Bruins Walk Off with Southland Track Crown; Muir Tech Second; Marks Undamaged in Spike Affair

Woodrow Wilson High School put on a swell "coming out" party yesterday as it was host to the Southern C.I.F. tracksters on Stephens Field, Long Beach, but the Bruins turned out to be very inhospitable hosts.

For the Bruins graduated yesterday morning from the Bay League to the Coast League and celebrated by annexing the Southern California prep track crown as Coach John Gartner's seven spikemen totaled 27½ points, exactly twice as many as they had scored in all former Southland meets. Needless to say, it was their first title.

It was a warm day to start with and the Wilson boys were at their hottest. Most of them turned in the best performances of their lives, and "Genial John" had reason to be very proud of his lads as they succeeded Jefferson on the champion's throne.

Muir Tech of Pasadena trailed in second spot with 14 points. The others scored this way: Inglewood, 10%; Santa Paula, 10½; Long Beach, 9%; San Diego, 9½; Santa

Monica, 9; Chaffey Union, 7; Claremont, 7; Glendale, 6%; Whittier, 6; Hoover, Glendale, 5½; Valencia, 5; Santa Maria, 5; Riverside, 5; Montebello, 5; Fillmore, 5; Fullerton, 4%; Pomona, 4; Redondo Beach, 4; Corona, 4; San Bernardino, 4; Excelsior, 4; Compton, 3%; Orange, 1; Alhambra, 1; David Starr Jordan, Long Beach, ¾; Carpinteria, ¾, and El Monte, ¾.

cerned the meet was rather flat, no varsity marks being set, and the athletes from the Los Angeles city schools were missed. Due to the change in schedules they did not enter the Southland meet this year.

But the sizzling performances of the Bruins made the meet a thriller.

Gene Putnam was their leading point maker, coming in third in both dashes and adding the relay team to a victory.

George Gray won the 440 as expected. Roy Seares surprised by placing second in the highs. Norman Standlee edged in third in the shot, but it was left to Dick Laughhead (pronounced Log-head and called, in affectionate fashion by his team-mates, Blockhead) to set the crowd of Wilson fans on their collective ears with his sparkling performance in the high jump.

## CLEAR 6FT. 3IN.

Laughhead had never leaped 6ft. 1in. before, but yesterday he skimmed over the bar at 6ft. 3in. to tie for first with Lipencott of Long Beach Poly.

Seares and Standlee likewise exceeded their previous performances, the latter adding better than a foot to his iron ball mark of 49ft. 4in.

For a couple of minutes it began to look as if Muir Tech would be a real threat, when young Mickey Anderson, brother of California's George, led the field to the tape in the short dash in somewhat of a surprise in 10s. flat.

Then Jack Robinson, brother of dusky Mack Robinson who performed for the Terriors a year ago, uncorked a tremendous leap of 23ft. 3/4 in. to top the broad jumpers and added a half inch to that a few minutes later. With this start the Pasadena appeared to have a chance but they couldn't keep pace with Wilson.

## "B" JUMPER STARS

Even this fine jump mark was eclipsed, however, by a Class B jumper, another Negro boy, Eddie Arnold of Tech, who leaped 23ft. 2 1/4 in., with three hops over 22ft. 9 in. Bill Bugbee, the 16-year-old Montebello tenth-grader who did 23ft. 4 1/4 in. a week ago, pulled a muscle, fouled on two jumps over 23ft. and wound up second at 22ft. 8 in.

Central California's delegates ran into all kinds of trouble. Bayer, Paso Robles half-mile star, was laid up with tonsillitis and could not come south for the meet. He had run better than 1m 58s.

Santa Paula's four horsemen, led

by Harold Claude Fortress, were hounded by tough luck. Fortress, a broadjump favorite, took two leaps, pulled a muscle and dropped out. He entered the high hurdles, won in 15.6s, and ran the lows, dropping out at the halfway mark where he was leading. His broad-jumping efforts were still good for second.

The officials had a field day in the low hurdle event.

One of the runners in knocking over his hurdle likewise knocked over a barrier in the lane occupied by Larson of Whittier, the latter being disqualified. They decided to run it over again, and Russell of Fillmore, the original winner, won again, with Larson fourth.
