

# Lawrence Leads Glendale to Cinder Crown

Al Lawrence, a lithe, energetic lad who will be 18 years old in a couple of weeks, put on a one-man show such as seldom has been equaled in Southland prep ranks yesterday as he sparked and generated the Glendale High track squad to victory in the C.I.F., Southern Section, track and field title at Hoover High in Glendale.

The Dynamiters rolled up a total of 33½ points to win their second Southern California crown and Lawrence personally accounted for 15 of them with impressive wins in the hurdles and broad jump.

Glendale won their first championship in 1927 when Frank Wyckoff was at the helm.

## Drops Baton

But, much as we would like to say that he anchored his school's 880-yard relay team to climax the day's work, we are forced to admit he literally threw the baton race and went unplaced. It was an accident, of course. Just a few yards from the tape and well out in front, Lawrence relaxed his hold on the round stick and it slipped out of his palm. By the time he had picked it up again the entire field had sped by.

It was a tough break to a great come-through performer and luckily it had no bearing on the team winner. Second place went to the well-rounded South Pasadena squad with 22, while Bonita, with the Davis brothers, Glen and Ralph, in fine fettle, placed third with 16. An-

ahheim and San Diego Hoover tied for fourth with 10 apiece.

Incidentally, Glen and Ralph leave this evening for West Point, where they expected to star for the Army grid and spike squads.

Lawrence skipped over the high hurdles in the fast time of 14.7s., the lows in 23.6s. and hurled himself 22ft. 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. to cop the broad jump. The low stick mark was just two-tenths off his own national interscholastic record which he set last week and the high barriers the same margin off the Southern California record.

### **Sink Misses Record**

Of the other potential national record breakers, Roland Sink, South Pasadena's mighty little mite, came within a whisker of bagging Louie Zamperini's mile standard of 4m. 21.2s. Sink, pacing himself beautifully, stepped off a 4m. 21.4s. effort. It was a genuine near miss.

Jerry Shipkey, powerful Anaheim weightman, was trying a bit too hard for the 58ft. 10in. standard and could only put the shot 53ft. 5in., far below his best.

The sprints both went to Zan Meyers, Lawrence's teammate, and Glen Davis was runner-up in both cases. The century time was slow—10.1s.—due to a moderate wind blowing against them, but they ran the furlong in the opposite direction and the clocks showed the difference—21.7s.

### **Close Finish**

Lester Jones of Anaheim nosed out Jeff Arnett, South Pasadena, and Bill Newton, Whittier, in the 440 that proved the day's closest finish.

The Dynamiters placed three men in the pole vault. Del Smith, a tiny redhead, scaled 12ft. 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ in., for first; Baglin tied for second at 12ft. 6in., and Walt tied for fifth at 12ft. 3in.
