

SWISSHELM WINS TITLE FOR SANTA ANA

Coach Pinky Greene's one-man track team from Santa Ana scored its maximum potential of 15 points in the CIF Southern Section track finals at Excelsior High yesterday and they held up for the team title.

Subject to a review of the finish camera showings tomorrow, Centennial finished second with 14. Next were Santa Monica with 12 and San Diego 10½.

The Dons thus retained the crown they won last year with

15½ points. And once again it was the sturdy little legs of Bill Swisshelm that did the big job. The Swish retained his sprint titles, but in unbelievably slow time, and anchored the winning 880-relay team.

Actually, Swisshelm's baton teammates deserve the credit for the victory. Keith Pocock, John Allen and Don Doty brought the stick in to Swish with a 3-yard edge and he galloped into the tape 8 yards ahead of Glendale, a surprise second. The time, fastest for the CIFers, was 1:29.1.

Only one meet record was broken in the Class A. The brilliant pole vaulting pair of Joe Rose, Glendale Hoover, and Bob McKay, Inglewood, arched over 13ft. 7½ in. to tack a half inch on the record.

Centennial, a one-year-old school with only sophs and juniors, came through beautifully in the hurdles and high jump for its points. Charles Dumas hopped 6ft. 5½ in. for the second time this year to win easily.

Ken Thompson came fast over the last three hurdles to

win the high sticks as favored Ernest McMurray of San Bernardino rammed the second barrier and went unplaced. The time was 14.6. Pete Andrews, also of Centennial, picked up two valuable points for fourth. The judges had a tough time picking third and fourth and it may be that there will be a switch here in Centennial's favor, which could earn them a tie for first place.

The lows also provided a rhubarb, though nothing will likely come of it. Going over

the last barrier Laguna's Jim Trainor was clearly ahead but Centennial's Paul Lowe, San Diego's Herman Thompson and Whittier's Mickey Machamer were dead even. The three bumped, all were thrown off stride and it's a miracle nobody fell. Thompson was awarded second, Machamer third and Lowe fourth. The time was 19.7.

The track proved quite dead and coupled with a slight headwind, marks were well below expectations.

Swisshelm, pressed by Santa Monica's Dick Dorsey in the 100, could do only 10 flat. In the 220 he beat Dorsey by three yards in only 22.3.
