

# Tripp Runs 20.5; Davis Upset; CIF Title to Poly

Two upset-minded stars from the border took the play away from the Los Angeles area in sensational style in the CIF track finals yesterday at Long Beach's gusty Memorial Stadium.

### Upset in 880

Arnold Tripp of Crawford scored two times with a 24ft. 9in. leap in the broad jump and a wind-blown 20.5 220 effort.

Meanwhile, his near neighbor, Jay Dunn of Chula Vista, laid back for one lap and then jumped highly favored Dick Davis on the turn to produce a smashing 880 upset in 1:54.7. It was Davis' first half-mile defeat in two years of varsity competition.

Tripp's jump is the best in the state this year and second in the nation. His 20.5 tops Mel Clipper's national and CIF prep record of 20.6 but won't be allowed because of a 7 m.p.h. aiding wind.

### Howard Runs 9.7

The other hero of the meet was Dee Andrews of L.B. Poly. He paced the Jackrabbits to the CIF title with two firsts — high hurdles (14.2) and low hurdles (18.9). Poly scored 24 points

ahead of San Bernardino's 15.

San Berdo's John Howard won the 100 in 9.7 despite bucking a 3.5 m.p.h. wind. Favored Stan Rhodes of Glendale Hoover failed to qualify in either sprint, being bothered by a hamstring.

The mile failed to produce a record. Dale Story of Orange and El Cajon's Jack Hudson battled it out as expected but the time — hindered by wind — was 4:17.7 with Story winning.
