## VISALIA REGISTERS UPSET FOR SECOND

CHAMPIONSHIP of the Central California Junior College Conference in the track and field industry went to Bakersfield Jaysee's potent Maroon and White forces for the third successive year as the conference meet came to a close last night under the arc lights in Visalia.

Five meet records were annihilated as the Renegades, who only won four events, stocked the score sheet with a liberal sprinkling of seconds, thirds and fourths to pile up 46 points and the loop champion-

ship. Visalia Jaysee's blue and orange clad trackmen pulled a neat upset by scooting into second place with 41½ points, beating out Taft, the team that was rated as a possible meet victor.

Taft finished in third place with 30 to be followed by Porterville with 23, Reedley with 21½, Coalinga with 3 and San Luis Obispo with 0.

Visalia's unexpectedly strong showing was supercharged by the man who was favored to win both dashes—and did, throwing in a sensational first in the 220-yard low hurdles to boot. Dick Browning of Visalia raced the 100-yard dash in 9.8 seconds to shatter Bakersfield Jim Tyack's mark of 10 flat made in 1933.

Second Best Time

He roared down the 220-yard stretch in 21.9 for first place and came back to win the 220-yard low hurdles in 23.9 to shatter the cid meet mark of 25.1 made by Denning of Taft in 1936. It was believed to be the second fastest junior college low hurdle time turned in in the nation this year—Zenas Butler of Long Beach clocking 23.5. He took third in the broad jump.

Lawrence "Butch" O'Connor led the Bakersfield forces with a double victory, winning the shot put with a heave of 44 feet 8¼ inches and copping the discus with a waggle of 133 feet 6½ inches. He took third in the javelin.

Holley of Visalia set a new meet
mark in the 120-yard high hurdles
when he topped the timbers in 15.3
to erase the old mark of 15.6 set by
Benton of the Renegades in 1935.
The two-mile record went by the
boards when Matthews of Reedley
turned eight laps in 10:20.5 to crack
the old record of 10:23.4 made by
Gonzales of Visalia in 1937. The
Taft mile relay team accounted for
the other record when it stopped the
watches at 3:29.5, bettering Bakersfield's meet mark of 3:31.8 made in
1934.
