Ray Pena contributed a mark of 49.8 in the 440, beating the 50 second flat set by Eugene Hofer of COS in 1955 and tied by Bob Fisher of Porterville less year Porterville last year. Dale Messer of COS set a 220 yard low hurdle mark of 23.7, two tenths of a second better than the 1940 mark of Dick Browning, COS, but also failed to improve on the only mark not broken—the broad jump, which he won at 22 jump, which feet, 1 inch.
