

COS Takes 7 Firsts In Winning CCJCA

VISALIA—It was to no one's surprise that powerful College of the Sequoias overwhelmed its opposition to win the team title in the Central California Junior College Athletic Association track and field meet Saturday night in the Mineral King Bowl.

COS dominated the meet by winning seven of 14 events. Included in the wins was a record breaking effort by Charlie Leathers in the 220 yard low hurdles, which he won at 23.4; a record equalling 9.7 time in the 100 by Bill Cowings and a record equalling 14.7 win by high hurdler Tom Powell.

COS also added firsts in the mile relay, with Jack Brewer, Mel Brooks, Cowings and Leathers passing the baton in the time of 3:19.9; Max Souder's 6-2 in the high jump, and Mickey Murray's 49-10³/₈ toss in the shot put.

Pole vaulter DeWayne Peterson of Fresno City College won the pole vault at 14—¹/₄ and teammate Curtis Craig won the sizzling half mile at 1:54.9. It is Peterson's second consecutive CCJCA title. Craig's previous best time was 1:56.9.
