Hartnell Panthers won a track meet Saturday in which each event was won with a new Coastal division, NCJCC record. It wasn't such a record smasher as it sounds, how-ever, because it was the first time this division has met on the track, and consequently all marks are records.

a short-lasting rain shower about midway in the track contests, but not enough moisture fell to slow things. Before the relay, final track contest of the day, was staged, the sun had broken through to last out the afternoon.

Dyer, Miller Double Winners Hartnell's Ray Dyer and Sherman Miller, classy Menlo mid-distance runner, each were double winners, but Miller grabbed a sec-ond in the broadjump and was awarded the individual trophy for the high point man of the meet. He had 13. Menlo also won the relay race, and picked up another trophy for the achievement.

There were a couple of races that had scorching finishes. The 220 in which Miller, Childs and Jack Mullen finished in that order was one of the closest of the day. There was not more than 18 inches separating the first man from the third place winner. Another torrid finish came in the 120 high hurdles when Hartnell's Steve LaVelle and Bill Temple finished almost neck and neck. Another yard and Temple probably would have won.

In the long 220 yard low hurdles, Don Smith of Hartnell was leading until he tripped on the next-to-last upright and fell, eliminating himself. Mathews of Marin, who won, was a surprise, as the Harts were figured one-two and possibly three with Smith, LaVelle and Temple scoring. Temple came in fourth.

There were close ones in field events, the shot coming as close as any to a tie. In the toss, Pike of Menlo pushed the 16 pound can-non-ball half an inch further than John Dobbel of Hartnell, to win with a heave of 44 ft. 7% in. Dobbel's best put was 44 ft. 7% in. Dick Leffingwell of Hartnell had puts better than these two men, but on each occasion, he fell over the line and was disqualified.

In the 880 yard run Kenny Dias was a surprise winner for the Panthers negotiating the halfmile in a slow 2:11.6. Cliff King was second. Hartnell had a one-two in the mile, when Dyer outlasted Bud Chase. Both men had more than lapped the third and fourth place men. Chase had a lot of kick

last lap, and probably used up 20 minutes to finish.

Jim Tannahill won the highjump at 6 ft. 2 in., narrowly missing the 6 ft. 4 in. try. Dobbel skimmed the discuss 124 ft, 3% in. to take that event.

Miller's Time Slower Miller, the outstanding athlete in the meet, ripped off the 440 in slower time than he carded in his last appearance here. Two weeks ago he did his favorite event in 48.9 seconds, Saturday it was 50.1.

The meet wound up the Hartnell home stand for the season and they will have some boys in the Fresno relays Saturday at Fresno and the following week at California relays at Modesto.

Saturday's meet was intended for Marin, but a wet track forced moving it elsewhere and Coach Ed of the Harts made the Adams catch.
