SAN DIEGO — Randy Hartman scored a distance double at the Pacific Southwest Conference track finals Saturday at Mesa Stadium to lead Palomar College.

The Comet's Len Thompson won the 120 high hurdles in 14.7. There was no team scoring. Palomar College nailed down 20 spots for the Southern California JC prelim at Cerritos May 15.

Tom Ries received an injury bye into that meet, giving Palomar a total of 22 qualifiers.

Thompson nipped Mesa's Wesley Williams at the tape breaking the Palomar record of 14.9 held jointly by himself and Ries.

Hartman outkicked teammate Rick Fox and Grossmont's Chuck Windsor to win the mile in 4:17.0.

Fox and Windsor ran a dead heat for second in 4:17.3.

Hartman's winning time for the two-mile was 9:26.7. He overtook Windsor in the last lap.

In the javelin, Rick Trestail and Bruce Galloway got second and third for the Comets with lifetime bests of 198-8 and 196-1.

Trestail's throw moved him to

eighth on the national JC list while Galloway is now ninth.

The winner, Jim Curtis of Mesa, threw 203 feet to break the meet record.

Southwestern's Lewis Wooten went 6-8 to win the high jump on fewer misses over Harold Greenwood from San Diego City College.

Pat Hallman of Palomar jumped 6-6 to tie his own school record. He took third place.

Comet Mike Quirk qualified

for the Southern Cal meet in four events, more than any other athlete in the conference.

Quirk went 13-6 in the pole vault for fourth place and also qualified in the long jump and both hurdles.

Quirk missed after having the bar moved to 13-9. Grossmont's Rick Olander set a meet record in that event by clearing 15-6.

Thompson also qualified for the Southern Cal prelims in the intermediate hurdles.
