# Rain Doesn't Hurt Marks At Drake's Big Carnival

## Illini Runners Equal World's Record in Two-Mile Event and Maroons Shatter Western Half Mile Time—West High Captures Many Firsts.

Many of the races on the programme of the Drake relay carnival Saturday were run off while rain descended heavily. Notwithstanding this fact a world's record was tied by Illinois university in the two-mile event, the western half-mile university mark was broken by Chicago "U," and very fast time was made by teams entered in other of the contests.

Rapp, Sanders, Tapping and Henderson, the four runners of the famous Illini two-mile quartette, each covered his half mile in the feature event of the day in 2:00 flat, the four completing the distance in an even 8 minutes. The mark equals that made by Michigan a year ago at the Pennsylvania carnival. The Chicago runners furnished closer competition for Illinois than any other school.

In the half mile contest the Maroons broke the western record formerly held by Illinois. The time of the Midway printers was 1:31 flat, which is two-fifths of

a second faster than the old records made at the Stadium in 1911.

Illinois also won the mile event, but the Iowa university quartette furnished a surprise by finishing a close second and crowding the Illinois for the lead. Mortimore, Shradler, Rock and Parsons, who made up the Hawkeye team, all covered the 400 in remarkable time, and on the last lap Parsons several times appeared to be about to overhaul Sanders, the Illinois star.

The half-mile college event was one of the feature races of the afternoon. The runners of Hamline and Coe colleges were the chief rivals, with the former getting a big lead in the first two laps. In the final spurt Collins of Coe very nearly overtook Cravs of the other institution, who won by a scant few inches.

West High was the leader in almost all of the high school events. The half mile contest, however, went to East High. Jarvis beating Brindley out at the tape. In the shuttle West was victorious but the famous Hoyt of Greenfield, starting from eighth place on the last 100 yard spurt overtook every runner but Wickersham, giving his team second place.

From a financial standpoint the carnival was not a great success, the rain cutting down the attendance materially. Those that did attend, though, stayed from first to last, making an odd spectacle as they stood in the west bleachers under a dripping awning of umbrellas.
