

MARCOONS WIN

AT DRAKE MEET, CUTTING TIME

Relay Runners of University of Chicago Create Half Mile Record.

The Illinois, Ia., April 17.—(Special.)—University of Chicago relay runners created a new record for the half mile event, one of the features of the Drake relay meet held here this afternoon in the stadium. The Marcoons ran the distance in 1:30 dipping their own record of 1:31 made here last year. Knight gave the Chicagoans the lead on the first relay and Ford, Beathard, and Barnack made a relayway of the contest.

With Ford gave Wisconsin the victory in the four mile relay, in which the Dodge runners set a record of 15:02, shattering the former mark of 15:04 made last year by Northwestern. It was completed in this event, and they are not better than the Purple Inn of 1:31.

Kansas to the Front.

Relay of Kansas jumped to the front at the start, but in the second mile record of Wisconsin forced ahead, while on the third relay Dodge maintained the supremacy for the Dodgers.

Harvey started the fourth mile for Wisconsin with a short lead, but on the word up of the last relay Carroll of Purdue passed the Madison man. On the word both sprinted hard, but Harvey showed the better burst of speed.

Purdue set a new mark in the two mile run by making the distance in 8:00, one and three-fifths seconds faster than the old record. Northwestern was a close second, Kansas came in third, and Ames in the last place to finish.

Marcoons Lose Colors.

The Marcoons finished first in the mile run, but were disqualified for losing their colors. A new record would have been recorded, as they were finished the distance in 1:30 1-3. The present record of 1:30 is held by Chicago, Missouri, which finished second, was awarded the race.

One of the largest crowds that ever witnessed an event here filled the big stadium. The weather was perfect, there being only a light breeze.

The boys in the college events went to Coe, which won the mile and half mile events and established new records in each. Marietta took the two mile run and lowered the record by 1:3 4-5.

One-half mile college—Won by Coe (Bailey, Lee, Mason, Lantry); Grinnell, second; Cornell, third; Dubuque, fourth. Time, 1:31 4-5.

Two mile university—Won by Missouri (Murphy, Lane, Ford, Keady); Northwestern, second; Wisconsin, third; Iowa, fourth. Time, 8:00 (new record). Chicago came in first, but was disqualified.
