

WORLD MARKS FALL IN DRAKE RELAY GAMES

Badgers Take Half, Mile, and 4 Mile—Maroons in Money Twice.

Des Moines, Ia., April 22.—Three more records were broken and two new world's records established today in the university class at the seventh annual Drake relay carnival. Seven thousand persons, many from colleges which participated in the relay, thronged the stands. Clear, cool weather made the day ideal for the sprinters. A high north wind, however, tended to slow the distance men on the back stretch.

In the special 22 yard dash, the feature event of the program, Hoyt of Cornell college scooped away from his competitors, completing the distance in 21 2-3. Robinson of Illinois was second, and Shearer of Drake a close third. The remainder of the field, which comprised some of the fastest men for the distance in the country, were closely bunched behind Shearer.

World Record for Hoyt.

According to Charles Stagg of Chicago, Farrell of Michigan, and Hill of Illinois, Hoyt's time represents a new world record for the 22 on a curved outdoor track. The best previous record was made by F. J. Walsh at Montreal, Sept. 21, 1912. He ran in 21 3-5. Several sprinters have made a dash in 21 1-5 on straight courses or tracks containing only a slight curve.

Wisconsin's four mile relay team capped the long distance feature and closed one-fourth of a second from the previous record for the event by stopping the distance in 18:42 2-5. Michigan landed second honors. Chicago and Iowa put up a magnificent fight for third place and the Maroons won largely through the great work of its fourth runner, Swell.

Badgers Win Half and Mile.

Wisconsin also set a new world's record in the half mile university, setting off the distance in 1:28 4-5. Wonderful sprinting by Smith and Carter did the work, Illinois was second, Holman making a game dash. Notre Dame, leader at the start, finished third. The three leaders at the finish were not ten feet apart.

Wisconsin's great team took the mile university relay, though hard pushed by Chicago. Diamond, Chicago's Negro runner, made a wonderful finish, coming from fourth to second in the last hundred yards. Missouri finished third.

Charley Hoyt, Cornell's crack runner, paced out Cummings of Hamilton and won first place for his school in the half mile college. Hamilton led three-quarters of the distance.

Purdue Takes Two Mile.

The two mile university race was a walkaway for the Purdue team. V. Campbell gave his teammates a good lead in the first lap and the other three ran over their opponents. The places of the teams were fairly well established at the start, although Drake, which held third place for a time, finished a poor fourth. The last Purdue man had a lead of 100 yards at the finish. Michigan, which was entered in the race, was drawn at the last moment. Iowa finished second with Kansas third. The time was 8:41 2-5.

Hamilton took first in the one mile college relay because of a splendid finish by Cummings. Hamilton, Cornell, and Coe were closely bunched all the way. The track was pronounced to be in perfect shape.

Montague made a job of the two mile college relay. Walter, the second Montague runner, gave his team a lead of twenty yards, which each succeeding Montague runner increased. Cornell's runners were hard pushed to take second.
