

# IOWA QUARTET SHOWS BEST IN 1 MILE RELAY

## Haskell Indians Create New Time for the 2 Mile Event.

Local track records continued to topple before the assault of athletes during the closing day of the sixteenth annual Drake relay yesterday.

Among the new records set was the time of 2 minutes 27 3/4 seconds laid out by Washington High of Cedar Rapids in the final of the class A high school half-mile relay. The Tigers, in setting the preliminary to the class A high school six-yard relay, covered the distance in 44 1/4 seconds, thereby establishing a new Drake mark.

The Haskell Indians set a new Drake mark for the two-mile relay which they won in 2 minutes 28 3/4 seconds.

Among the brilliant victories of the day were those by Galesburg of Muscatine in the two-mile special event and by the University of Iowa quartet in the university one-mile relay.

### Local Races Sprint.

The race of record breaking which started Friday and which was continued in the preliminaries this morning, was resumed in the opening event of the afternoon program. Washington High of Cedar Rapids cracked the first record of the afternoon in the half-mile, class A relay. The Tigers were clocked in 2 minutes 27 3/4 seconds, slipping one-tenth of a second from the record set by Northwest High of Kansas City in 1921.

Cedar Rapids broke another record in the morning preliminary by winning its heat in the 100-yard high school relay, class B, in 44 1/4 seconds. The old record also was held by Northwest High of Kansas City at 45 1/4 seconds.

East High of Des Moines raced to victory in the two-mile, class A high school relay. The great running of Baird, winner of the 100-yard dash in the state meet last year was largely responsible for East High school's victory. Baird carried the last 200 yards of the race and hit the tape with a good lead over Doug of Troy High school, who finished second.

### Centers Spectacular.

Hansen, delegation Charles Indian running for the University of Oklahoma, outpaced the field in the 124 high hurdles. Hansen had a lead of about three yards when he hit the tape with time of 21 minutes 14 seconds of Nebraska and University of Kansas finishing in order. The winner's time was 21 minutes flat.

The 100-yard dash was one of the features of the meet. The leading sprinters of the race matched their feet side down the straight away. Parker of Missouri swung out a narrow victory with Grady of Kansas, Smith of Wisconsin and Johnson of Missouri coming in the next three in the order named. It was a spectacular event, like none that has ever separated the best and best men at the track.

Ames failed in its attempt to shatter the Drake relay record in the two-mile university relay but won a brilliant victory over a fast field. Chicago university was second, the Kansas State third and Northwestern university fourth. Iowa set a time of 7 minutes 12 1/4 seconds was less than a second above that of Ames last year.

### Hapsara Take Mile.

The old-time Hapsara took first honors in the one mile relay. The race was run in two sections, the first section winning the first section in 2 minutes 27 1/4 seconds. Cornell college was the second section in 2 minutes 21 seconds.

Wagon of Illinois defeated Chase of Kansas college in the first place in the broad jump. Chase was national champion in 1924. Chase's last jump was 22 feet 3 inches, while Chase was now and coach had broken that of Hapsara's last year.

The 100-yard university relay, the preliminary of which provided a sensation Friday when Hansen shattered the Drake relay record, provided another thrill but this time it was University of Iowa athletes who played the leading role. The Iowa quartet, which set the remarkable new Drake record for Kansas, making the total time in 2 minutes 27 3/4 seconds, was clocked for the event and set the pace for Iowa and for Kansas, which equalled Iowa's time in the preliminary. Kansas finished second in the final, record of Iowa breaking the tape was time in final of draft, Hansen's great sprinter, Hansen was third and Drake fourth.

Rock City High school was high honors in the class A high school mile relay. The race was run in two sections. Rock City winning the fastest section in 2 minutes 27 1/4 seconds. Cornell High school, which had a mile relay in the first section was dropped to second place in the final running as Cornell was clocked in 2 minutes 28 1/4 seconds.

The 100-yard university relay, the preliminary of which provided a sensation Friday when Hansen shattered the Drake relay record, provided another thrill but this time it was University of Iowa athletes who played the leading role. The Iowa quartet equalled the remarkable time set Friday by Hansen, making the total time in 2 minutes 27 3/4 seconds. The record for the event will be set largely by Iowa and Kansas.
