

Six new records were established last night as the Riverside Tigers captured the junior college conference track, field honors on the San Bernardino jaysee field after registering a total of 82 5-6 points.

The Braves, figuring twice in the record breaking spree, scored a total of 47 2-3 points to annex second position. The order of the runner-ups was as follows:

Fullerton, 31; Chaffey, 27; Santa Ana, 21 1-3; Citrus Union, 13½; Pomona, 1 2-3.

Coach Bill Neufeld's athletes captured six first places to pile up the heavy margin in carrying out the dope as pre-meet favorites. The Tigers, led by Orv Nichols, won the 220-440 dashes, then Sloat came through with a victory in the 880. Stevenson won the two-mile romp while his mates, Boyd and White finished in order to boost Riverside's scoring orgy. The Tigers added the first place points in both the broad and high jumps.

FOUR VICTORIES

Coach A. F. Schaefer's Braves took four wins, with the peerless timber topping by Arthur Fisher resulting in 10 points. Fisher won the low and high hurdles and his individual glory was perhaps lost in the classy performance of Warren Wood and Captain James Miller who scored new conference records.

Warren Wood was in the best form this season and hurled the discus 145 feet 10½ inches to win over a classy field.

Captain Miller who had been figured as a possible third place winner after Daneri and Roland Nichols, offered one of the upsets last night by shimmering the javelin 180 feet 6⅝ inches to score a new record.

Daneri, of Santa Ana had been conceded by track and field critics as the best javelin tosser but he was unable to do better than 178 feet 3½ inches which is just short of his best mark this season.

Fullerton won the relay with Riverson and San Bernardino following in order. In the broad jump, Anderson of San Bernardino offered an upset by taking second place and Clought came through to place second in the high jump.

In the 440-yard dash, the race was bunched and although it appeared that Wilbur Cline had a third place, the judges agreed that in untangling the close finish the San Bernardino youth had been fifth.

The initial track meet held at night on the illuminated junior college field attracted a large crowd. Weather conditions which did not seem to warrant exceptional performances was good enough, it appears, to chalk up six new conference marks this season.
