

# SEVEN MARKS FALL AS J. C. ATHLETES IN ANNUAL BATTLE

## Fullerton, Santa Ana Finish Second and Third; Bill Smith Shatters Record

Amid the wreckage of seven record-shattering performances, Riverside jaysee retained its Eastern junior college conference track and field championship in the annual meet held yesterday at Riverside.

Riverside athletes, running pretty much true to form, rolled up 58½ points, to lead Fullerton and Santa Ana, second and third place teams, which finished with point totals of 47 and 40, respectively.

Coach Art Schaefer's San Bernardino Indians finished fourth with 27 points, after winning two events and making creditable showings in five others.

### CITRUS FIFTH

Citrus was fifth with 21¼ points, Chaffey sixth with 19¼ points, and Pomona last with 11 points.

Bill Smith, Indian captain, broke his own conference record in the two-mile, running the eight-lap event in 10:03. His old record, established last year, was 10:09.2. Smith was half a lap ahead of the field when he finished.

Leroy Stanton was the other San Bernardino winner, taking the javelin throw with a toss of 179 feet, 9½ inches. It was by far his best toss of the season, and came within nine and a fraction inches of the conference record.

Elton Wieman, running his best quarter mile of the season, pushed Miller of Fullerton to a new conference record. Miller won the event in 48.7, and Wieman was second in 48.9.

### JIM SUTER THIRD

San Bernardino athletes checked in with three thirds. Jim Suter was third in the high jump, Harold Wieman finished in that spot in the 880, and Phil Dotson tied for third in the pole vault. Danielson added another point to the Indian total by finishing fifth in the two-mile.

One of the biggest thrills of the meet came in the relay, won by Fullerton with San Bernardino second. A two-way fight between teams from Fullerton and San Bernardino throughout, the final lap saw Elton Wieman hooking up with Miller, the Hornet ace.

Miller had a two-yard lead when the last lap started. Wieman tailed him to the final turn, and then moved up to a challenging position. Down the final stretch, the two runners were not half a step apart at any time, and they finished in that way, with Miller breaking the tape.

### WEIGHTMEN STAR

In addition to the record broken by Smith, the other new marks established were as follows:

Vickery of Chaffey in the low hurdles, Berkley of Fullerton in the high jump, Carter of Riverside in the 100, Moore of Fullerton in the 880, Miller of Fullerton in the 440, and Sinclair of Riverside in the mile.

Riverside can thank its husky weightmen for its triumph. Going into these final weight events, Riverside held a lead over Fullerton of less than two points. However, Riverside men took four out of five places in the discus, won the shot put, and took two places in the javelin.

Tom Berkley, dusky Fullerton athlete, won high point honors with a total of 14 points. He won the high hurdles, high jump and placed second in the low hurdles.
