Chaffey's big Johnny Rogers let record disfly with another cus toss, breaking his own mark he set in the prelims Wednesday. Rogers twirled the platter 157 ft. 11/4 in., not too far from Sim Iness' national JC record of 164

The only other record to fall was the mile relay mark. Mt. San Antonio's quartet, headed by Hap Hicks, sped the distance in 3:24.4, lowering the record set in 1950 by Santa Ana of 3:24.7.

The Dons won 8 of 15 events in rolling up 851/2 points. The Mounties displayed plenty of depth in collecting 75 5/6 points, but lacked the class to retain their title for the third straight year.

The rest of the field, topped by Chaffey, was far back. The Panthers totaled 23½, followed by Orange Coast with 10 5/6, San Bernardino and Riverside with 9 each and Fullerton with 61/3.

Under the new scoring system adopted by the conference this year, counting dual meets and the EC meet together, Santa Ana scorthe maximum number points, 12. The Dons collected points for winning all their dual meets and 5 for taking the big meet Saturday.

Chaffey's third place Saturday gave it four points for the season and landed Coach George Colbath's Panthers in a tie for third with Orange Coast in the final standings.

The Indians' Bob DuSair put on a terrific stretch drive to nip Fullerton in the last lap of the relay, giving the Braves third in that event. Don Hedlund of Chaffey nearly

pulled off the upset of the day when he just missed winning the 100-yard dash. Hedlund got a good start and led the pack right down to the wire before he was caught by Santa Ana's Dick Keck.

Ted Litwiler of Chaffey tied for first in the pole vault with Bud Baber of Mt. Sac at 11 ft. 11% in. Other Panthers to place were Dale Bunch, who took fourth in the 220 and fifth in the 440, and Dean Smothers, with his second in the broad jump.

Charley Neal of Santa Ana won the individual high-point trophy with 12 points for the day.
