

Bruins Dominate at Santa Barbara

A couple of Trojan yearlings who are certain to be heard from next year, Ken Peach and Bob Van Doren, both tossed the shot 48ft. 8¼in. to deadlock for first in the Junior College Division. They also bettered the SC Frosh mark of 48ft. 4in. set by Jess Swope two years ago.

In winning the jaysee javelin at 193ft. 8in. Larry Goins of Pasadena stretched his own Bulldog school record four inches.

John Bradley, another Trobabe, displayed sharp form in taking the jaysee century in 10s and running speedy laps on two relay teams.

Bruins Score

UCLA took the first open event of the evening, the four-man 440 relay, like the good things they were tabbed. With Craig Dixon on the anchor leg the Bruins won over runner-up Santa Barbara by 14 yards in the meet record time of 49.9s.

A couple of SC freshmen, Ken Peach and Bob Van Doren each put the shot exactly 48ft. 8¼in. to tie for first in the junior college section.

spot at No. 1 for the South Americans.

The Argentines, however, even as the United States four, are hoping that their injured stars will answer the whistle for the first chukker.

Should Pedley and Brown play, two 7-goal men will be replacing two 8-goal men, so the Argentines will yet enjoy a three-goal advantage with a total of 35 goals on the individual handicap rating. This contingency will occasion proof, too, of Aidan Roark's greatness as a polo strategist and team player. Smith Captain

Balancing that will be the North Americans' team spirit, each player being a competitor who does better as pressure is applied. Evinger especially, playing at back, is a master horseman who plays well above his 7-goal rating when the chips are down.

Cecil Smith will captain the North American team and probably play at No. 3 position. Pedley, if he plays, will be at No. 1, while Roark will take over this spot if Oliver is able to be at No. 2. Otherwise the Santa Monica star will move back to Oliver's position.
