

Visser Leaps

26-2; Shot Put

Duel Fizzles

SANTA BARBARA, April 16—The shot-put proved a fizzle but the long hoppers came through to make the 22nd annual Easter Relays a successful event for a record 9,000 fans here today.

Lt. Bill Nieder of the Army won his first clash of the season with Dave Davis in what had been tabbed as a sure-fire attack on the world shot-put record. Nieder won but neither could eclipse even the current world record of 63ft. 4in.

Winning Effort

Nieder's winning effort, on his last try, was 63ft. 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. While the best Davis could muster was 62ft. 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. Two weeks ago in the Texas Relays Nieder did 65ft. 7in., while last week in an exhibition Davis did 64ft. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Even the meet mark of 63ft. 2in. made last year by Dallas Long, then an SC freshman, survived.

Eight meet records fell during the nine-hour, 91-event meet but the people got the biggest bang out of the broad jump performance of Henk Visser, who leaped 26ft. 2in. to obliterate the meet record of 25ft. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. set by Roy Range in 1958.

Beats Great Field

Visser, 28-year-old veteran from the Netherlands, outleaped a great field of five 26-footers. Greg Bell, a bit off stride in his season debut, had four fouls but got a good one of 25ft. 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. for second. Visser, who was voted the meet's outstanding athlete, is the former European champ. He leaped 26ft. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. in 1955.

The San Jose State sprinters, Bob Poynter, Bob

Brooks, Jim Flemons and Willie Williams, dashed off a 40.6 440 relay to set a mark. The Spartans were reversing a victory by the Santa Clara Youth Village in the 880 chase in which ex-Spartan Ray Norton anchored for a 1:25 clocking, another record.

Hop, Step Mark

The other meet mark to fall came in the hop-step-jump in which Kent Floerke, formerly of Kansas now in the Army, did an even 50 ft. The old mark was 47ft. 4 1/2 in.

Jan Sikorsky, Camp Pendleton Marines, topped a fine field to win the javelin with a record toss of 257ft. 4 1/2 in., second best in the nation this year.

Just at dusk, Arizona State's mile relay team warmed up the fast cooling cinders with a 3:11.2 clocking, best in the nation. Mal Spence anchored with a 46.2 leg to beat out the Santa Clara YC's Keith Tomlinson, who did 46.7.

Lt. Don Bragg accounted for the other meet record, clearing 15 ft. 2 1/2 in. to top the pole vault field; Ron Morris tied the mark of 14 ft. 11 1/2 in., while world record holder Bob Gutowski, who held the meet mark, was fourth at 14 ft. 6 in.

After coasting to a 9.5 100 in a heat with a brisk wind at his back, Norton repeated the effort to equal the meet mark as the wind died down.

Beatty Wins

Little Jim Beatty, ex-North Carolina star now of the Santa Clara Youth Village, stood off teammate Laszlo Tabori to take the Nick Carter Mile in 4:06.1, a tenth better than the mark set by Tabori last year. They finished inches apart with Jack Wilcox third at 4:09.4 and Max Truex fourth, 4:10.4.

Five marks fell in the jay-see division, topped by the 9.5 century effort of Dennis Johnson, a Jamaican now at Bakersfield.
