

Brewer, Mile Relay Spark Trojan Triumph

SANTA BARBARA—SC's potent track and field squad did a little bit of all right Saturday in the 23rd presentation of the Easter Relays at La Playa Stadium.

Coach Jess Mortensen's Trojans ran away with team honors in the university-college division by amassing 66-5/6 points, vaulter Jim Brewer achieved his all-time best to tie the meet record of 15ft. 2½in. and the mile relay quartet raced to a dead heat with Arizona State in meet record time of 3:10.6.

And Brewer was voted the outstanding contestant of the chill, windy day, which put a crimp in most performances. Brewer's height tied Ron Morris' all-time SC high and duplicated last year's jump here by world champion Don Bragg. What's more, the slim senior got over the bar at 15-6 ¼, only to knock it off on his descent.

The mile relay race, which wound up the 88-event program which began early in the morning with high school competition, was a thriller for those hardy souls in the

crowd of 6,200 who remained to the bitter finish.

Rex Cawley of the Trojans and Mal Spence of the Sun Devils, received the batons almost simultaneously for the anchor lap, but Cawley promptly was blocked by Mel Spence and was four yards behind before he could get clear.

But Troy's all-around sophomore star pulled up even just at the wire. The Arizona foursome was the same which set a meet mark of 3:11.2 last year.

Bobby Staten, Dean Balzaret and Kevin Hogan preceded Cawley around the track, with Hogan's 47.1 the best clocking of the combine. Mike Barrick, Karl Schreiner and the Spence twins did the heroics for Arizona State, with Mel's 47 flat the best of the lot.

Speedy Sprints

A pair of 9.5 centuries were run, but both were disallowed because of helping wind greater than the law allows. Hubie Watson, former Jordan High swift now

cavorting for Arizona State, turned that fleet trick in the University-College class to edge Occidental's Doug Smith, while John Howard of San Bernardino achieved that clocking in the junior college finals.

Fresno, by the way, took JC team honors with 31 points.

Carr Takes Discus

Competition was hot and heavy in several field events involving the collegians, resulting in real good marks.

Norm Grundy of SC, Tom Howard of Long Beach State and Dennis Jones of Cal Poly SLO tied for first in the high jump at 6-6½. Four discus slingers went over 171 ft. as UCLA's Gerald Carr won at 179-3. And four broad jumps better than 24 ft. materialized, with Phil Kirkpatrick of UC Santa Barbara the winner at 24-10¼.

Troy's Dallas Long wasn't pressed in the shot put, but nonetheless got off a heave of 62-5.

A national junior college record tumbled in the distance medley relay as the Fullerton quartet of David Parsley, Jan Underwood, Leroy Neal and Harry McCalla did 10:03.8. The former mark was 10:09.7, made by Santa Ana last year.
