

BULLDOGS GIVE WOLVES BITTER FIGHT FOR TITLE

Moose Disbrow Of College Of Pacific Is High Point Man Of Day

ACCOMPANIED by the breaking of nine conference records and the tying of another, the University of Nevada scored a close 60½-point victory in the Far Western Conference meet held in the Fresno State College Stadium here yesterday afternoon.

Close behind the winner, who captured the event for the second successive time, came Fresno State College with 56 5-6 points and College of the Pacific with 42 1-3 markers. California Aggies and St. Ignatius trailed far in the rear with 7 1-3 and 4 points respectively.

From the time the Wolves' fleet dash man, Kellogg, won the century in the conference record-breaking time of 0:29.8 until the relay squad set a new record in the 440-yard relay of 3:28.4, the invading horde from Reno slowly piled up their winning array of points to lead the meet at all stages of the program. Kellogg also tied the former record for the furlong with a time of 0:22.8.

Moose Disbrow, giant Pacific weighttossler, captured the individual scoring honors of the afternoon with a total of seventeen. The big Tiger won first places in the javelin, the shot put and the discus and took third in the broad jump.

Disbrow's weight tossing activities set records in two of the three events he won. An old mark in the javelin of 161 feet, 2½ inches by his teammate Reimer fell under a new heave of 167 feet, 9½ inches. The old record in the shot of 43 feet, 3½ inches made by Allen of Nevada was bettered by Disbrow's winning toss of 44 feet, 1 inch.

Charlie Kaster, captain of the Fresno State College Bulldogs, was second high scorer of the day with 12½ markers to his credit for victories in the hurdles and a tie for second in the high jump. Kellogg of Nevada, with 11¼ points was third in the race for scoring honors.

Fresno fell down in the high jump, the javelin and missed the services of Clyde Whelden in the dashes, but otherwise the dope ran true to all advance notices. The record breaking activities of the day were expected as the old marks set last year were made at Nevada in bad track weather.

Lester Glover, former captain of Nevada, ran a beautiful mile to nose out Maurice Abbott of Fresno for the tape. Both men finished strong and were a stride apart at the finish. Clover grabbed an early lead and resisted all efforts of Abbott to pass him while the two left the rest of the field far in their wake. The time was a new record of 4:31.4 to beat Clover's old mark of 4:38.4.

Jesse Markle, freshmen Bulldog half-mile artist, had everything his own way in the 880 and ran a fast two laps to finish five yards ahead of Barron, of Saint Ignatius, his nearest competitor to place. A Nevada entry was second at the finish but was disqualified. Markle's record-breaking time was 2:0.0 to better the old time of Hartung of Nevada which was 2:3.4.

Kellogg of Nevada knocked off two-tenths of a second off the old century mark of Robinson of Nevada of ten seconds flat. All the four places came flocking in at once.

Other new records were made in the 440-yard dash by Mackay, Pacific, who bested an old mark of 0:52.8 and hung up the new time of 0:51.6; and in the high and low hurdles by Kaster, Fresno. The new low stick mark is 0:28 as compared with the former time of 0:25 flat held by Miller of Pacific. The record in the high sticks now is 0:15 flat as compared with the old time of 0:15.6.

Lohse of Nevada might have made an addition to the rapidly tumbling records had he had any opposition but the Wolf distance man had things all his own way and finished with a lot of drive apparently held in reserve in the poor time of 10:35.2. His nearest competitor, H. Bailey, also of Nevada, was far in the rear.

Irwin Ginsberg, holder of the best conference broad jump mark, made last season with a leap of 22 feet, 3 inches, served as an official while his teammate, Andrews, of Fresno, took first place with the mediocre distance of 21 feet, 1½ inches.
