

FAR WESTERN CONFERENCE.

Fresno State, 65; San Jose State, 49½; ^NCollege of Pacific, 16 1-3; Chico State, 13½; Nevada University, 10 1-3; California Aggies, 8 1-3.

FRESNO STATE COLLEGE was the winner of the track and field meet held in the Sacramento Stadium Saturday afternoon. The Fresno Bulldogs won the annual Far Western Conference championship with 66 points to San Jose State's 49½.

Record Not Allowed.

Because of a strong south wind that blew down the straight-away the records made Saturday will not stand.

Fresno dominated the Far Western Conference meet, taking nine first places. Talbot of the Bulldogs pole vaulted 13 feet 4¾ inches for the only record to be allowed. Walter Marty, nationally famous high jumper for Fresno, stopped jumping after winning the event at 6 feet. The cold weather prevented Marty from going higher.

Aggies Handicapped.

The California Aggies were handicapped in the meet by the loss of Captain Clay, who was sick and unable to run. Clay was favored to finish up among the leaders in the 880-yard run. The Aggie relay team was also hurt by sickness.

"Chuck" Henry of Chico surprised by winning the 220-yard low hurdles. Wilson of Fresno, the favorite in the event, was scratched by Coach Flint Hanner after Wilson had injured his leg winning the broad jump.

Smithe gave Nevada its one first place with a win in the two-mile jaunt.

Hoobyar Places Twice.

Johnny Hoobyar, former Sacramento Junior College star, placed second in the 220 and third in the 440-yard runs for the College of Pacific. Hoobyar led in the quarter mile until the last fifty yards. "Chuck" Bardin, another former Panther running for C. O. P., was fourth in the 100-yard dash.

100-yard dash—Won by Salvato (San Jose); Ayers (Fresno), second; Taylor (San Jose), third; Bardin (Pacific), fourth. Time, 0:9.7. (New record. Old mark of 0:9.8 held jointly by Salvato (San Jose), 1932, and Kellogg (Nevada), 1928.)

440-yard run—Won by Harris (Fresno); Brantley (Fresno), second; Hoobyar (Pacific) third; Horner (Fresno), fourth. Time, 0:49.0. (New record. Old mark of 0:49.5 made by Hubbard (San Jose), in 1929.)

120-yard high hurdles—Won by Denham (Fresno); Murphy (San Jose), second; Knight (San Jose), third; Feck (Aggies), fourth. Time, 0:15.1.

Javelin throw—Won by Cunningham (San Jose); Challis (Pacific), second; White (Fresno), third; Meyers (Chico), fourth. Distance, 203 feet 11¾ inches. (New record. Old mark of 199 feet 10 inches made by Rowland (Fresno), in 1932.)

Shot put—Won by White (Fresno); Jorgenson (Chico), second; J. Lewis (Fresno), third; Keyes (Fresno), fourth. Distance, 45 feet 1¾ inches.

High jump—Won by Marty (Fresno); Murphy (San Jose) and Reid (Chico), tied for second; Corson (Pacific), Bledsoe (Nevada), and Hamilton (Aggies), tied for fourth. Height, 6 feet.

Two-mile run—Won by Smithe (Nevada); Hatch (Pacific), second; Champion (Fresno), third; Barnett (Aggies), fourth. Time, 9:58.0.

880-yard run—Won by Robinson (Fresno); Orem (San Jose), second; Clemo (San Jose), third; Schneider (Chico), fourth. Time, 1:57.7. (New record. Old mark of 1:57.9, made by Markle (Fresno), in 1931.)

220-yard dash—Won by Salvato (San Jose); Hoobyar (Pacific), second; Hill (Nevada), third; Taylor (San Jose), fourth. Time, 0:22.2.

Pole vault—Won by Talbot (Fresno); Prouty (San Jose), second; Wool (San Jose), third; Stevens (San Jose), fourth. Height, 13 feet 4¾ inches. (New record. Old mark of 13 feet 3¾ inches made by Wool (San Jose), in 1931.)

220-yard low hurdles—Won by Henry (Chico); Denham (Fresno), second; Feck (Aggies), third; Wright (Aggies), fourth. Time, 0:24.1.

Broad jump—Won by Wilson (Fresno); Taylor (San Jose), second; Shehtanian (San Jose), third; Marty (Fresno) fourth. Distance, 21 feet 11 inches.

Discus throw—Won by McPhetres (San Jose); Keyes (Fresno), second; Westphal (Aggies), third; Adams (Chico), fourth. Distance, 139 feet 7¾ inches.

Relay—Won by Fresno team of Bridges, Horner, Brantley, and Harris; San Jose, second; Pacific, third; Aggies, fourth. Time, 3:25.6.
